The West Column



Sometimes a phrase or saying just simply sticks in your head for no apparent reason. One such phrase which often comes into my head was one I heard on an edition of the Michael Parkinson show many years ago, when Dame Flora MacLeod was asked why (she would then be in her nineties) did she still retain such a passion for reading and learning. Her reply was simply; "education ceases only with death and only then according to your beliefs". That phrase has resonated with me all those years ago and considering that Dame Flora died in 1976 at the age of 98, you will appreciate that my memory is not too bad after all.

Dame Flora was a very interesting woman. She was actually born in 10, Downing Street, the home of her grandfather, Sir Stafford Northcote, who was, at that time, Chancellor of the Exchequer. In 1901, she married Hubert Walter, who died in 1933 and with whom she had two daughters. Her mother was Lady Agnes Mary Cecilia Northcote and her father was Sir Reginald MacLeod. Sir Reginal became Chief of the Clan MacLeod in 1929 and Flora was elected President of the clan's society and went to live with her father at Dunvegan Castle in Skye. She was widowed in 1933 and upon the death of her father in 1935, she inherited the estate and was recognised as the 28th Clan Chief of the Clan MacLeod. She was created a Dame in 1953 and lived at Dunvegan Castle until 1973 before moving to Ythan Lodge in Aberdeenshire where she died in 1976, aged 98. She is buried at Dunvegan Castle.

Why this biography lesson. Dame Flora, as previously mentioned, had two daughters, Alice (MacLeod) and Joan, who became Mrs Wolrige Gordon and we come to the link between Dame Flora MacLeod and our present Grand Master Mason, Brother Charles Iain Robert Wolrige Gordon.

All of the above is simply a bit of (hopefully) interesting background information. The purpose of this leader item is to draw attention to the words which made such an impression upon me at the time. "Education ceases only with death and only then according to your beliefs".

I was reminded of this recently when I attended the walk through degree which the Right Worshipful Master of Lodge Cumberland Kilwinning No. 217 kindly undertook following my request to him and an excellent job he made of it. I thoroughly enjoyed the evening as I believe did most of those who attended. On the evening, we had nearly all the Masters in the Province present along with around 70 brethren from all the Lodges in the Province. The experience was a pleasant change from the usual exemplification which while they serve a purpose when no candidate is present, it cannot be denied that, no matter how well it is executed, there is something missing.

Any criticism that I heard after the meeting was all very positive and we will take a number of suggestions on board but overall, the event was warmly received and is all part of the efforts being made to make membership of the Craft more fulfilling, especially for newer members.

And that is the only part of the evening which was slightly disappointing – there were very few newer members of the Lodges present to hear a fuller explanation of the Entered Apprentice Degree. The assembled brethren mainly comprised of more experienced and established members of the Craft and most welcome they were.

As Dame Flora suggested, education and learning is a lifelong exercise and to quote Isaac Newton, when it comes to freemasonry, "what we know is a drop, what we don't know is an ocean".

Over the last few years, we have provided explanatory booklets for new members, we have organised seminars, arranged for members to join in with the Provincial Grand Lodge of Renfrewshire East in their Intender training schemes and now offered the first of hopefully a series of walk through degrees.

It would be hoped that those seasoned members of the Lodges will now go back to their respective Lodges and try and encourage the newer members of the Lodge to come along and support future initiatives.

Education, especially when it comes to freemasonry, is a lifelong (and perhaps longer) vocation!



Interesting story from Brother George Nixon, PM1121.

Enclosed is an article written by the late Brother George Gray, past master of 1121 and may of interest to you for publishing in West Column :

"3rd September 1892.why should this date 21 years before 1121 was instituted and 40 years to the day when the temple at McDougall Street was opened be so important?

Anchored at the tail of the bank was the Steel Barque 'SS Auchmountain' built by Russell of Port Glasgow. She was bound for Australia with general cargo, pottery, paper, and stationery from Greenock, linen and shawls from Belfast, Paisley and Ayrshire, furniture and candles from Glasgow and lastly loaded on the last day from Kilcreggan, 20 tons of gunpowder in 50lb barrels presumably for gold mines in Kalgoorlie.



On the eve of sailing, fire was discovered in the fore part of the ship too strong to be extinguished, she was left to burn out or blow up. Blow up she did and parts of her cargo were found as far afield as Port Glasgow and Cardross.

Windows were shattered at Carwood Street, Belville Street and Princes Pier and throughout Gourock. The explosion was also heard at Dumbarton and Renfrew. Two weeks later a worker noticed a teakwood pump station floating in the wet dock at the Kingston Yard in Port Glasgow. It measured about two feet long by four inches square with a hole bored lengthways through it.

21 years later, 1121 having received their Charter from Grand Lodge, needed a charter case, the pump station was turned down, engraved suitably, mounted with silver ends, presented, and has been used by Lodge Crawfurdsburn to this day, the only relic of the loss of the 'Auchmountain'.

Founder member and the first Master of 1121 was John Clark (joiner), who gifted numerous

important items to the lodge and though he is not minuted as the donor. It is believed that the Charter case was a work demonstrating his affection and pride in his newborn lodge".

He's keekit ower yer private deal, Exposin' whit he could reveal, To bring the Brethren a' to heel By his vile story; A' for the glory o' the De'il, Or his ain Glory An', senseless as a new-born wean,
This birkie has it in his brain
That muckle damage ye are dain'
Wi' squares an' gauges;
It's damned near driven him insane –
That's why he rages.
A' men that handle apron strings,

Compasses, squares or mason rings Will ne'er wear ony angel wings, Nor taste the manna, 'Cause damned are a' masonic things By Maister Hannah!

The daunnert cratur's ill at ease;
Mixed up amang yer gran' degress;
Dumfoonert wi' yer "anes, twas, three"!
He's low in spirit
Gaun ower yer tiles on hans an' knees
Like ony ferrit!

This gowk is actin' unco rash
In gi'en ithers' creeds a slash,
To mak' some dirty, ill-got cash,
An' empty gain;
By loadin' book-shops up wi' trash
We a' disdain.

Alas! 'tis sad this day an' date
