Thank you for some of the nice comments I received on my piece last month regarding the hymn “Abide with me”! As I confessed in last month’s leader column, its publication was due to a shortage of preparation time but many of you still appeared to find it interesting. Not as interesting or as thought and comment provoking as the previous month’s issue on which I touched on the subject of public rebuke as opposed to constructive criticism so to an extent I would like to return to that theme in this month’s issue.

However, I will start with a short riddle. What is it that as soon as you think you have it, you’ve lost it? The answer is, of course, humility.

I am often astonished at how dogmatic people can be, especially politicians, many of whom have the attitude that they are never wrong. They will not even consider for a single moment that someone else may just hold an opinion which, if different from their own entrenched view, can be even worthy of consideration. It seems that when some individuals obtain a position of power, they believe that they have achieved some sort of exalted status that results in them being always right. In the Gospel according to St. Luke, (14:11), he has some good advice for such people. “For everyone who exalts themselves will be humbled and he who humbles himself will be exalted”.

Yes, a little humility goes a long way. Sadly, in my experience in my former working life in Local Government, it was common to find elected officials (that’s co-councillors to most of us) to suddenly believe that they were experts in all manners of things and often took the opportunity to berate ordinary employees, from a position of power, in all sorts of way.

Of course, such examples of power corrupting, can be found in all walks of life and I’m sure that we can all recall examples of individuals “getting above themselves”. Sadly, our Craft is no exception to such behaviour and we have often seen brethren attaining rank and power only to exercise it in a dogmatic or autocratic fashion.

At this point, I would say that I have always tried very hard to consider other points of view but if at any time, any Brother considers that I am getting above myself in my position as Provincial Grand Master, then I sincerely hope that you will give me a very sharp tug on my coat tails.

In the Book of Proverbs, we receive excellent advice on this subject: “When pride comes, then comes disgrace, but with the humble is wisdom”; “The way of a fool is right in his own eyes, but a wise man listens to advice”!

As we present the implement of authority in a Lodge, be that a maul, a gavel or a mallet, to a newly installed Master, we charge him to yield it with discretion and wisdom and not to act in a dictatorial or autocratic manner.

It is one of the most important pieces of advice that can be provided to a new and inexperienced Master. It is always important to seek out and consider the views of others especially those who can bring experience and wisdom to assist in the responsibilities of leading a Lodge. The Lord gave us TWO ears and only ONE mouth and sometimes it's helpful to use them in that proportion.

At this time of the year, it is perhaps particularly appropriate to have in mind humility as Jesus was born not into wealth and status but in the most humble of circumstances.

Turning back to the Scriptures, I would finish up with a quote from Philippians; "Do nothing from rivalry or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests but also to the interests of others".

Perhaps if we all showed a little more humility, the Lodge, our workplaces and the world around us would be better off for it!

It only remains for me to extend my very best wishes to you and your families for a very happy, peaceful and joyous Christmas.

While the main purpose of the West Column was originally (and still is) to inform brethren of forthcoming meetings, it is important that other news items are included. Articles can be submitted by anyone, it does not need to be the Lodge Secretary.

Reminder - Advertising of meetings:

The Constitution and Laws of the Grand Lodge of Scotland provide for three ways in which to advertise Lodge meetings.

1. By intimation at the previous Regular Meeting.
2. By advertisement in the local newspaper published at least 48 hours prior to the meeting.
3. By circular delivered or posted to every qualified member at least 5 days prior to the meeting.

The above are the three permissible methods of convening meetings. It is not necessary to use all three; in fact, one method may be used for all meetings. The Lodge bye-laws must make clear which method will be used for any particular meeting.

For many years, the Provincial Grand Lodge of Renfrewshire West has compiled and published a composite advert in the Greenock Telegraph newspaper which has resulted in a significant saving to all Lodges over the previous practice of advertising meetings individually. However, due to the reducing readership of the Greenock Telegraph, it would appear to be the case that Lodges no longer consider this method of advertising to represent good value for money. One Lodge has already withdrawn from the composite arrangement and a further two are in the process of changing their bye-laws to effect a change.

As a result, it was agreed at the most recent meeting of Provincial Grand Committee that Lodges would be informed that the practice of advertising using a composite advert in the Greenock Telegraph would be discontinued from the end of the 2017 – 2018 session. This allows Lodges to fully consider the matter, determine what method they will use to advertise their meetings and allow a period of time to make appropriate alterations to their bye-laws.

In the event that Lodges determine that they wish to discontinue advertising in the Greenock Telegraph, it is recommended that the bye-laws should be altered to simply use option 1 above. This does not preclude the use of other means of advertising meetings such as the West column, Facebook, Lodges websites etc.

It is further recommended that in the event that a Lodge wishes to alter its bye-laws to reflect this change, consideration is given to any other changes which might be made at the same time such as fees etc. Finally, it is strongly recommended that before a change to Lodge bye-laws is submitted to the Lodge as a Notice of Motion, a draft is submitted to Provincial Grand Secretary for approval.

If any Brother wishes to advertise their professional services in the West Column, please let me know and I will be happy to include them if space permits.

Defibrillation Equipment.

On the subject of advertising, there is later in this edition of the West Column, an advert for First Aid Training which is offered by Brother Bryn Hopper, a member of Lodge Firth of Clyde, Gourrock No. 626.

It is understood that many Lodges are currently considering the installation of defibrillation equipment on their premises and it is again confirmed that such equipment may be purchased using funds from a Lodge's Benevolent Account, if that is convenient.

Many firms will offer to sell such equipment but of course there is an element of training which is also required and which can also be costly.

To this effect I am happy to draw to your attention an offer made by Brother Hopper to the Lodges in the Province who is willing to sell such equipment for the special price of £699.00 plus VAT and provide training necessary, free of charge.

Byelaws and Notices of Motion:

Brethren, could I please urge you to ensure that any proposed changes to bye-laws be discussed with the Provincial Grand Secretary BEFORE compiling a Notice of Motion for submission to the Lodge. This will ensure that the Motion is in an acceptable format and avoid any delays caused by having to have the proposal reworded and resubmitted.

Renfrewshire 200 Club (RW200Club).

Application forms are also still available within each Lodge. If you have not already "signed up" I hope that you will give your earnest consideration to this excellent method of charity fund-raising which should at the same time, assist in boosting attendance figures throughout the Lodges. The monthly entry fee is £5.00. However, those wishing to participate are not limited to any number of "entries" and if anyone wishes to purchase two or more tickets they may do so. It is hoped that Lodges will also participate by purchasing tickets and perhaps this could be favourably considered by your General or Finance Committees.

Members may either pay cash (cheques should be made out to the Provincial Grand Lodge) or may take out a standing order arrangement. You can also take part on a monthly basis but to take part in the draw your contribution, whether by cash, cheque or standing order must be with the Provincial Grand Treasurer prior to the draw taking place.

Please remember that a minimum of 50% of the income will be going directly to charity.

The fund has enabled Provincial Grand Lodge to make charitable donations to the recipients of the Province's Citizen of the Year Award for the last three years and as reported fully below, the sum of £10,000 was presented to REACH for Autism, Inverclyde at the Province's annual Summer Ball. This supplements donations already made to the Girl Guides and Hammy's project in Port Glasgow and a proposal will be made at the Regular Communication in October, to dispose of the remaining funds prior to the new Commission taking over on the 1st February 2018.

Commemoration of the Fallen 2018.

Just a reminder that arrangements are being made for a parade and Church Service to take place on Sunday the 18th November 2018, to mark the end of the First World War.
