

Can I commend to all but especially to those making their way up through the offices, hopefully perhaps towards the chair of their Lodge, the new publication available from Grand Lodge and priced at a very reasonable £3.00 per copy, £1.00 of which is going to Masonic Charities.

The booklet is the work of the Information and Communications Committee and is a very easy guide to Masonic Etiquette and Best Practice.

It covers the A to Z of decorum within the Lodges from the correct positioning of the Altar to correct forms of Address, to Visiting. The booklet also contains guidelines for the use of Masonic Websites, Email and Social Media. One copy is currently being sent to each Master, free of charge and thereafter, the booklet will be available to all to purchase.

Obituary: Worshipful Brother Evan Corbett.

Usually, any obituary posted in the West Column will refer to a Brother who has been a member of one of the Lodges in the Province. However, I would like to make mention of the passing of a great friend of many in the Province and to those in Lodge Greenock St. John's No. 175 in particular.

Brother Evan Corbett was a regular visitor to the Province and to the Installations and inter-Lodge visits between Lodge Greenock St. John's No. 175 and Gibson Lodge (Irish Constitution). Brother Evan could accurately be described as a larger than life character whose sense of fun affected all with whom he came in contact.

Sadly, Evan suffered much from ill-health in recent times and probably spent more time in hospital than he did at home. However, not to be deterred, Evan set up his own facebook page, called *I'm H.A.P.P.Y.*

In it he regularly chronicled his adventures with the nursing staff in hospital in Belfast and in describing his procedures, in his usual humorous way, often left me laughing out loud. In spite of his illness, he never seemed down and was wonderful example to all of good spirits.

Following his passing, I noted that the mother of a young schoolboy had posted in his facebook page, how much Evan's friendship had meant to her son. A lovely way to be remembered. (Incidentally, Brother lan Gregory is keeping the facebook page alive and you could worse than reading through it for some inspiration about how to meet with adversity)!

Evan's passing will be mourned by many and I'm sure that many in the Province would join me in extending our sincerest condolences to his family and to his Lodge.

One of my favourite quotes is by a Greek philosopher called Pericles and I think it sums up Brother Evan Corbett perfectly.
