Do you need a Pilot?

Now there's a question for you – do you need a pilot? My better half and I were taking advantage of the fact that we had no childminding duties for a couple of weeks and so booked ourselves a nice cruise for two weeks and a wonderfully relaxing time we had.

In fact, one of the nice things about a cruise is the absence of worrying about time and just letting the world go by. Often these cruises give you a day in a port and generally set sail for the next port of call around early evening and a favourite part of my day was having a small refreshment and watching the preparations for departure. Of particular fascination for me was watching the small pilot boats as they would bounce over the waves then scuttle in close to the side of the ship to catch the pilot as he would jump nimbly from the ship back on to his own pilot boat.

Every time I watched, I could hear the old seaside mission hymn in my head;

Do you need a pilot, signal then to Jesus; Do you need a pilot, bid Him come on board. For He will safely guide, across the ocean wide, Until at last, you reach the heavenly harbour.

The Captain of our own ship, all 55,000 tonnes, regularly made the announcement that we would depart as soon as the pilot came on board and it struck me that in spite of our size, we still had to depend on the skill and ability of the pilot on board a little pilot cutter probably weighing no more than 200 tonnes.

I couldn't help but reflect that there was one of life's great lessons for us in the act carried out by the pilot that no matter how big and how important we become, there are still times when we require a little experience to guide us through the difficulties we encounter in life and indeed sometimes that guidance can come from the most unexpected of sources.

We should always be willing to listen and to open our hearts and our minds to kindly words of guidance whatever the source. This is true in our Craft whether the advice is provided from the "grumbling old Past Master" or that older Brother who, although never taking office, has sat in the columns for the last forty years,

Of course, it isn't just upon the ocean, or indeed within the Lodge, that we can benefit from a pilot in our lives. From childhood to manhood, we learn from the experience of others. The concept of God and Jesus acting as our pilot has been recognised for centuries. As far back as the 17th Century, the Puritan writer Thomas Watson wrote that "the ship without a pilot rather floats than sails. O what mercy is it to have God as a pilot".

Over the following years, many hymns have been written in the same vein, perhaps the most well-known being "Lead us, heavenly Father, lead us, O'er the world's tempestuous seas".

The World's tempestuous seas can be a metaphor for life's journey and we all need a pilot.

"Yet I am always with you; you hold me by my right hand. You guide me with your counsel and afterwards you will take me into glory".

The simple seaside mission hymn and the verse above from Psalm 73 are a good reminder that when we find ourselves going through the storms of life, that there is one who will lead us through them. He is one who sails with us through all the buffeting and dangers of life. He does not guarantee us calm but He does guarantee that we will reach our heavenly harbour at last.

And of course, the moral lessons provided by our Craft also give us that guidance.

Do you need a pilot? Signal then to Jesus and bid Him come on board!

Here's an example: "In the early years of Jewish settlement, the term "a boaz" (plural "boazim"), derived from the Biblical character, was used to refer to a rich private farmer or landowner."

So we should build on Boaz's kindness. He was a man of wealth and power but looked after those who needed his kindness. He looked after Ruth, a foreigner in his country. So let's remember to show kindness to everyone, but maybe especially to those that need it.


