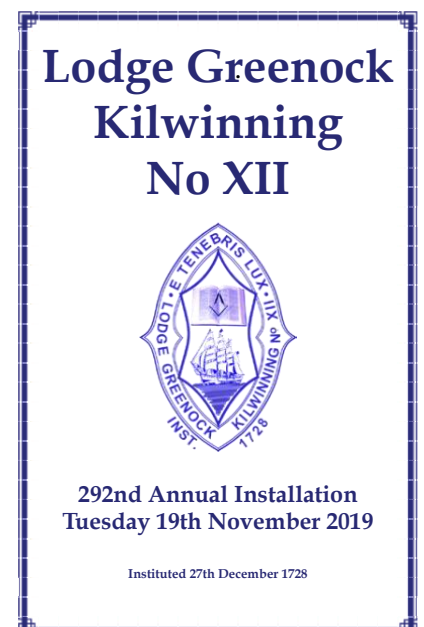

### **Greenock Cenotaph**

Most years, I am at the Cenotaph in the Well Park for the Service of Remembrance. In years gone by, it was with my Dad and my Uncle both of whom served in World War II. Sadly, they are now in the Grand Lodge Above. Often, in the past, it has been as a piper in a band. I was interested to see Inverclyde Pipes and Drums on parade this year, many of them being members of the Craft. I joined the brethren of No XII who were paying their respects. The wreath was laid by Bro. Captain Allan I. MacFeate PM who served for many years in our Merchant Navy. It was been a beautiful sunny day. Rev Alan Sorenson led the worship, and his words were poignant and moving. 3 of the Greenock Masonic Lodges laid wreaths: Lodge Greenock Kilwinning No XII, Lodge Greenock St John's No 175 and Lodge Crawfordsburn Greenock No 1121. It has been



good to see this development since No XII led the way in 2012 when Bro Alan D Beck was RWM. It is appropriate that our Lodges are present, being, as they are, inexorably linked to the fabric of the community and its social history and their brethren having contributed so much.

Bro. Jimmy was resplendent in his medals. One was his own, awarded for his being on active service in the Canal Zone when he served in the Royal Artillery. Although earned in the early 1950s, Bro Jimmy told me that this was the first time that he had worn it, although he is an ever present at the Cenotaph for the Services of Remembrance. The other was earned by his brother on active service in Cyprus.

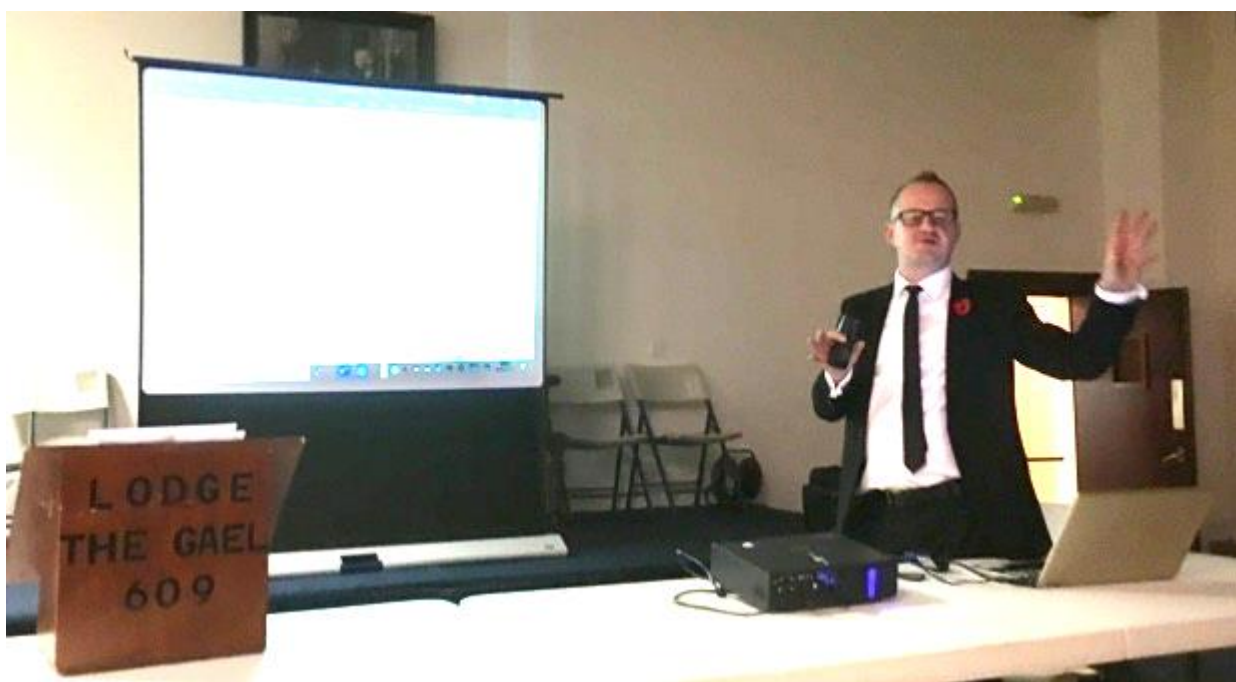
Shields PM of Lodge St. Vincent Sandyford No. 553 and the lament “The Flowers of the Forest” on the Great Highland Bagpipe from Bro. Keith J. Bowes PM. Prior to the Act of Remembrance, Bro Keith A. Bowes PM, himself a former Scots Guardsman, explained that the Roll Call was important after the regiment had been in action so that the Officers would know the availability for the next action. Thereafter, a very poignant Roll Call was held where the Master and the 2 Wardens responded “Present” to their names and there was silence as the names of the 21 Fallen Brethren of Lodge the Gael were then called.



After the Lodge was closed, we had a wonderful lecture where Bro. Keith A. Bowes, assisted by Bro. Robin Shields PM (553), told the stories of the Fallen of Lodge the Gael. It was testimony to the many hours of research put in by Bros. Bowes and Shields. The latter was created an Honorary Member for his efforts and support for the Lodge.

Perhaps the most moving part of the evening was hearing about Mrs McIntyre, the mother, whose two sons were members of Lodge The Gael and Merchant Seamen. They were both killed on the same ship

## The Charity Drive 2018-19 Cheque Presentations September 2019

*The following report was submitted to the Greenock Telegraph which subsequently published a piece on No XII's charitable donations.*



Lodge Greenock Kilwinning No XII is Inverclyde's oldest organisation having been instituted in 1728. As freemasons, the brethren of No XII have the concept of helping those in need at the heart of all that they do. This is reflected in the importance placed on the annual charity drives. Various fundraising activities support these charity drives with the most significant being the annual Charity Burns Supper in the Town Hall.

RWM Bro. J. Robert Crossan recently presented a cheque for £1000 to Ardgowan Hospice. Bro Crossan said, "In No XII we are anxious to make a difference in our community. We are very happy to pass this cheque over to help Ardgowan Hospice for it was the charity that Provost Brennan nominated for us to help and we are delighted that he is here to assist with this presentation to Linda McEnhill, the Chief Executive of the Hospice." The close links between No XII and the Corporation of Greenock and now Inverclyde Council stretch back to 1765.

Each year the Provost is asked by the Lodge to nominate a charity in recognition of this special relationship. Provost Brennan said, "I am very grateful for the work that Lodge No XII does for the community and for the Lodge's generosity."

Also, a cheque for £500 was presented to Chief Petty Officer Jimmy Cairns RN, who received it on behalf of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines Charity. Bro Crossan said, "We are very proud in No XII of the work done on behalf of us all by the men and women of the Armed Forces and always acknowledge this in our Charity Drives."

The third charity to benefit from the generosity of the Lodge was the Samaritans. Branch Director Alexandra Southee and Hazel O'Brien were on hand to receive a cheque for £1000. Alexandra and Hazel said, "We have great pleasure in accepting this very generous cheque. Each branch is self-financing and fund raising takes up a lot of time. At present, Inverclyde Samaritans continues to thrive with 24 volunteers and 7 more to be trained. We are there for everyone who needs us."

This year No XII will also support Poppy Scotland acts as an ongoing sponsor for the Greenock Cricket Club and the Greenock Wanderers Rugby Football Club.

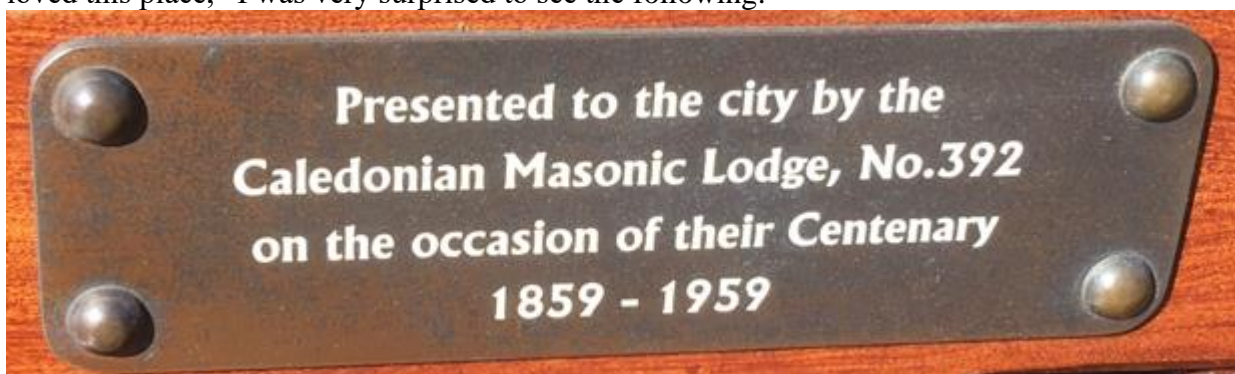

## An Interesting Find in an Edinburgh Street

In May past, my work took me to St George's School for Girls in Edinburgh. The event I was attending was the annual seminar dinner of SELMAS (The Scottish Educational Leadership Management and Administration Society). I had taken the train to Haymarket and it was a lovely evening, so I decided to walk, something that I had done to get to St George's many times before. Turning left as you come out of Haymarket Railway Station the route takes you straight along the road heading for Corstorphine. As I crossed the bridge that takes the road over the Water of Leith, I noticed a bench.



Nothing too unusual about that. However, being an inquisitive sort of chap, I had a wee look at the plaque on the bench. Expecting it to be in memory of a person with an inscription like “He loved this place,” I was very surprised to see the following:



The Caledonian Lodge No. 392 seems to be very active, as a look at its website will tell you. Thereon, I found the photo below which is of the Past Masters alive at the time of the Centenary in 1959, with the Centenary Master, Bro. Thomas Liddle Leckie Lindsay. Its premises are close to where the bench is situated.

## The Way We Were – The Grants (Continued)

I am still working on the feature on the late Bros. Grant (Stewart and Ian) who were members of No. XII and lived in the Bow Road opposite our Bros. Glenny. As I said in the last 4 editions, it all began some time ago when Stewart's son Keith contacted Lodge Secretary Bro. Ken MacDougall PM and I am now involved in a flurry of emails with the Grant family. I am now in contact with another Grant – Euan – who is a cousin of Keith, Calum and Ian (The latter two are Ian's sons and Calum is a member of No XII). Just to keep your curiosity going on this one, I am publishing a little more information.

Bro Stewart Grant, Initiated into Lodge Greenock Kilwinning No. XII on 18<sup>th</sup> April 1944. This photo was taken after he had moved to Hong Kong. He worked there as a joiner in the Taikoo Dockyard. He became Worshipful Master of Cathay Lodge No. 4373 E.C. in 1962/63
