### From the Old Minute Books – 1859 Part 2

I am currently involved in some research regarding the Lodge in the 1850s for a contribution to another journal, and, as part of the task, I have been reading, and transcribing, the minutes for all 6 meetings of the Lodge that were held in 1859. The second of these is below in transcription. It is exactly as in the Minute Book. I have not added any punctuation, altered any spellings etc. It does make an interesting read.

## At a meeting of the Lodge Greenock Kilwinning held with the Royal Hotel Greenock on the evening of 8th November 1859

Present Wm McClure RWM JF Mackay SW

D Crawford acting JW Jas Newton SD John Scott Yst JD J Scott Jr Secy

Brethren D Latham JC Sicklemore A Leitch H Crawford

The Lodge having been duly opened the minutes of two previous meetings were read when the meeting proceeded to consider the state of the Lodge accounts and property and resolved unanimously

1st That the Grand Lodge accounts be immediately settled

2nd That all arrears of annual subscriptions be got in without delay and that the new subscription be called for at next meeting.

Senior warden Mackey reported that the cost of a copper plate of the kind mentioned at the last meeting was found to be £10 to £12and that the funds of the Lodge would not admit of his

procuring it at that time Bro David Crawford moved and Br Latham seconded a solution that was carried unanimously that this plate and 50 copies on Vellum be procured immediately. The RWM reported that he had not yet recovered the Minute Book from Br Donald McNicoll the late secretary. It was unanimously resolved that the RWM would take what steps as may be necessary to recover the Book and that the Minutes be then written up and completed. If he do (sic) no recover the book that he report the case to the Provincial Grand Lodge Master. It was resolved that the election of Office Bearers take place on the first Tuesday of December. Brother Adam Leitch proposed, and Brother Sicklemore seconded that Alexander Anderson be admitted a member of the Lodge. Brother Sicklemore proposed, and Brother D Crawford seconded the proposal for affiliation of Lieut Bridges of HMS Hogue. The Lodge unanimously approved of these proposals and that the gentlemen be invited to next meeting. Thereafter, the Lodge partook of refreshments and after pleasantly Harmonizing in the light the Lodge was closed in due Masonic form.

It was a busy evening for Lodge business. HMS Hogue is mentioned again with Lieutenant Bridges of that vessel proposed for Initiation at the next meeting. The matter of the Grand Lodge accounts was resolved and our payments due were to be made immediately. The need for diplomas was taken to the next stage with a resolution that 50 be printed. The matter of a missing Minute Book was discussed, and it would seem that the situation was being escalated with a mention of the potential involvement of the Provincial Grand Lodge Master should it not be forthcoming from "Bro Donald McNicoll, the late Secretary." All of this was achieved before the Harmony.
