## Bro 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant James Hannah No. XII Great War Casualty Gravestone Repair and Reinstatement

Our regular readers will remember that it was reported that the gravestone in Greenock Cemetery for Bro. James had been badly vandalised and that the Lodge determined to have it fixed. We have had the go ahead from the Cemetery authorities and the process has begun.

Fraser Downie (Stokes Memorials of Dunoon) has begun the job of restoring the stone to its former glory as may be seen from the photos below.

The bottom part has had new holes bored; the middle part has been freed from the ground and new stainless steel screwed rods fitted; the top part has been freed from the ground.







I shall provide regular updates on progress as the process goes on.




The details below the photo are: "Lieut. James Hannah, Ross Battery, RGA was accidentally killed at Nairn. He was a native of Greenock, and prior to joining the colours last May, was master of the Supplementary Classes in Finnart School, Greenock. He was a son of Mr James Hannah, 99 Dempster Street, Greenock. Deceased was to be married on Friday first."

#### The Definitive No. XII Ritual

It was away back in 2009 that Bro. Hector Macphail PM first circulated the initial part of the first draft of what he hoped would become a definitive No. XII Ritual. Just 30 pages long back then, it has since grown to the final product which is now available in book form.

The text was painstakingly typed, edited and re-edited by Bro Hector, helped by comments and suggestions from the Lodge Past Masters. It was surely a labour of love and monumental effort and goodness knows how many hours Bro. Hector spent on it. Latterly, Bro Bob Crossan IPM was heavily involved formatting the text and dealing wee errors that were found. He too did an

amazing job and we are very grateful to him also. At times, I'm sure both Hector and Bob could have seen the project far enough! They stuck with it to bring us to where we are today.



More recently, the final proof was sent to Bro. Andy Mushet, RWPGM of Glasgow and proprietor of Anderson Printers. The final product is a handsome hard back single volume of 200 pages and A6 in size, designed to slip easily into a jacket pocket. The development was supported by the generous bequest from Bro Gordon H. Dickie to the

Lodge when he passed to the Grand Lodge Above in 2016.

Derek has taken a legion of photos of our artefacts and I am sharing them with you a few at a time. He did another session in June of this year when many more photos were taken.




A Master's jewel dating from the time that the Lodge was No. XI. It is ornate and solid silver

Another solid silver jewel, this time looking like that of the Depute Master. Again, this dates to when the Lodge was No. XI but close inspection will let you see that some 'amateur jeweller' has tried to add an additional Roman I to the right of the XI. What on earth possesses people to do things like this?





Another ornate, solid silver Master's jewel. Close inspection will show that a central part is missing (the 4 eyes/rings to which it would have been attached)



A square and compasses set that would be possibly used on top of the Volume of the Sacred Law. This was presented to the Lodge by "JRA" I have an idea who JRA was, but more research is required. It is interesting to note that the Lodge is described as 12 rather than XII. This happened on and off, for lengthy periods of our history. It is only in the last 50 or 60 years that the use of the Roman Numerals has been strictly adhered to
