What's it all about?

Over the years, I have found that the Craft is criticised because, "You just look after your own." I have never believed this. When you look at the charitable work done by The Grand Lodge of Scotland, Provincial Grand Lodges and Daughter Lodges, the evidence is there for all to see of our work in the wider community. Maybe we aren't as good as we might be in publicising our good works, but we are improving at that. Over the past 10 years supporting others has been an important facet of the work of No. XII.

However, there is more to looking after folk than handing out cheques.

Recently, I met a fellow Mason that I hadn't seen for a wee while. His Dad had passed to the Grand Lodge Above and I expressed my condolences which led him to tell me a sad, and very disturbing, story. Over the years his Dad had supported their Mother Lodge well. He had been an Office Bearer, excellent floor worker and supporter of social events. He had not been around so much in recent years owing to a variety of reasons; in the past few years failing health had been the major factor. His Mother Lodge was aware of his challenges but during the last 3 or 4 years, his Dad received no contact from the Lodge for which he had worked so hard: not a single phone call, email, card or letter – far less a visit; nothing. The son had emailed the

Lodge directly on 2 occasions to explain his Dad's situation. Even this brought no response for his Dad. This upset the whole family. Nothing changed and Dad sadly passed to the Grand Lodge Above.

"Looking after our own?" In this instance, I think not. My friend is now questioning much about the Craft – and especially his Mother Lodge - and no wonder. This should never happen but it has and the question must be asked – "How many brethren have found themselves in a similar situation?" It's a rhetorical one. If the answer is even one Brother, it is one too many. My Mum used to counsel me as I grew and developed with many little aide memoires. One such was, "Manners cost nothing." That comes to mind now because I am thinking that neither does kindness. nor empathy, understanding. Even a greetings card is not too expensive.

Since hearing this sad story, I have been taking a good look at myself in this regard. Perhaps we should all do likewise, both as individuals and as lodges?

Bro. Samuel McGonigle 1950 – 2nd October 2023

We had not seen Sam McGonigle in the Lodge for some time but back when he joined, he was a regular attender. Initiated on 7th September 1982, Passed on 7th December 1982 and Raised on 15th February 1983 he was a Port Glasgow man who was a joiner in the Port shipyards. Bro. Jack Glenny was Master when Sam joined.

A quiet, pleasant and unassuming Mason, his was good company to be in and those of us who were around back in the day were very sad to read of his passing to the Grand Lodge Above.

Bro. James Twaddle 1947 – 9th October 2023

Bro. George Twaddle 2nd February 1948 – 11th October 2023

It is a very sad thing when the Lodge loses 2 brethren to the Grand Lodge Above. It is made even more upsetting when the Brethren concerned are siblings. Such was the case with the Twaddle brothers – Jim and George – who passed within 2 days of one another on 9th and 11th October respectively. We hadn't seen them in the Lodge for some years, but I can remember when they were regular attenders and very much part of the fabric of No. XII. Really nice gentlemen they were.

Although the younger brother, George was in the Lodge before Jim, being Initiated on 7th March 1969, Passed on 2nd December 1969 and Raised on 16th November 1969. The Master at the time was Bro. Alistair A. Kirkpatrick (father of Crawford and Grandfather of Derek PM). Jim was Initiated on 16th February 1971, Passed on 7th September 1971 and Raised on 7th December 1971. This was during the term of Bro. RJ Drainer Jr. as Master.

George and Jim were preceded into the Lodge by their brothers Hugh and Thomas in 1965 and 1966 respectively. Bro. Hugh was a very regular attender until he passed to the Grand Lodge Above in 2016 at the age of 80 years. His son, also Hugh, is a member of No. XII. I have no idea what has become of Thomas. Perhaps if anyone does, they could let me know? An interesting, yet unusual fact about the Twaddle brothers is that they were all gardeners apart from Jim who was a mechanical assembler.

Our thoughts and prayers are with the families of all these brethren. We were shocked to hear of the sudden passing of our Tyler **Bro. Ewen Maclean**. After a lengthy spell of ill health, he had been at our meeting in September and was very positive about the future. An obituary will be published in the next edition of *Twelve Talk*.

LODGE GREENOCK KILWINNING No XII - THE FALLEN REMEMBERED- 2023

A memorial to the members of the Lodge who fell in the Great War was unveiled and dedicated on Friday 31st March 1922. It took the form of an altar in gothic design, made of Scottish oak, has been greatly preserved, and has been central to our ritual and assemblies for just over 100 years.





Bro 2nd Lieutenant James Hannah No. XII Great War Casualty Gravestone Repair and Reinstatement

Our regular readers will remember that it was reported that the gravestone in Greenock Cemetery for Bro. James had been badly vandalised and that the Lodge determined to have it fixed.

As reported in Issue 161, Fraser Downie (Stokes Memorials of Dunoon) has been working on the job of restoring the stone to its former glory

As may be seen from the photos below, the bottom part had new holes bored; the middle part had been freed from the ground and new stainless steel screwed rods fitted; the top part had been freed from the ground.

I returned on 22nd September and further progress was evident as may be seen from the photos on the left.

And finally, in time for Armistice Day 2023, the restoration was all but completed. The three pieces are back together and the stone has been cleaned so that its lustre has returned. Also, the re-lettering process has begun and this will finish the job nicely.

No. XII on the Road (again) The Brethren and the search for Masonic Lodges




