

The Charity Drive

£1500 presented to Sir Gabriel Wood's Mariners' Home



The photograph above is of RWM Bro Allan I MacFeate with Stephen Bradley, the General Manager of the Mariners' Home, as he accepts the cheque from the No XII Charity Drive. The photo appeared in a recent *Greenock Telegraph* along with the short article below.

"As freemasons, the brethren of Lodge Greenock Kilwinning No XII have the concept of helping those in need at the heart of all that they do. This is reflected in the importance placed on the annual charity drives. Recently Right Worshipful Master Bro Capt. Allan I. MacFeate presented a cheque for £1500 to Stephen Bradley of Sir Gabriel Wood's Mariners' Home. Each year, No XII's Master has the opportunity to nominate the good causes that will be supported by the Charity Drive. Naturally enough, the choices made reflect his interests and connections. It was no surprise when Bro Capt. MacFeate, as a retired master mariner, nominated the Mariners' Home.

The widow of Sir Gabriel Wood founded the home as the result of a bequest left by her husband on his death. He had been Commissary General of Accounts for Canada. The son of a Greenock merchant, he was born in Gourock in 1757.

The foundation stone of the Mariners' was laid in October 1850, with full Masonic Honours, by Sir Michael Robert Shaw Stewart, 7th Baronet of Greenock and Blackhall who was a member of No XII and, at that time, Provincial Grand Master of Renfrewshire West. Opened in 1854, the Mariners' has been extended and refurbished over the years and is now held in trust by the British Sailors' Society and administered by a local volunteer committee. The Committee was

delighted to receive the handsome donation for the benefit of the residents and to assist with its good work.

This year the brethren of No XII will distribute over £7000 and more presentations are yet to be made.

Lodge Greenock Kilwinning No XII is Inverclyde's oldest organisation having been instituted on 27th December 1728."

Recently our own Bro Ivan Scott PM moved to live at the Mariners' and he tells me that he is settling in well and enjoying his new surroundings.

XII Annual Installation Tuesday 17th November 2015 at 615pm

Bro Capt. Allan I MacFeate has been nominated and elected into the office of RWM for 2015-16. His Installing Masters will be Bros Iain White, Kenneth C MacDougall and Hector Macphail, all Past Masters of No XII. The Installation will have the full ceremonial and an Installing Board will be constituted in an adjacent apartment. Dinner in the Town Hall will follow the meeting and, as is the tradition in No XII, the Deputation of Visiting Brethren will be led by the RWM of Lodge Doric Kilwinning No 68 who will also reply to the Toast at the Dinner. This year, the RWM of 68 is Bro William Lawson a 'weel kent face' in No XII being such a regular visitor.

Freemasonry in Washington DC - Part 2

Perhaps the brethren would be interested to know that I have attended many meetings in the House of the Temple in Washington DC over the years representing Scotland - especially on Saturday, 22nd August 2015 when I was a guest of the Southern Jurisdiction USA at the Centennial rededication ceremony of the House of the Temple which is their headquarters.

It is a wonderful building and also houses the second largest Robert Burns library in the world after the Mitchell library in Glasgow.

The rededication was a spectacular event with over 600 present. It was a beautiful sunny day and following the rededication the guests enjoyed a garden party in the gardens at the rear of the building. I have enclosed a couple of photographs if you wish to use them. The first photograph is in the Executive Director's Office and is the framed flag Jim McGregor refers to - the one taken to the moon. This is seldom seen and was part of a special exhibition as shown in the second photograph."

From the Old Minute Books of No XII

Over the years, social events in No XII have waxed and waned. In the early years of my membership of No XII, I can remember very grand dinner dances being held in venues like the Tontine Hotel in Ardgowan Square, the Queen's Hotel in Gourock and the Co-operative Hall in Roxburgh Street. The latter two venues are now long gone and some of our younger members may not even remember them!

With the introduction of the Masonic Ball by the Provincial Grand Lodge of Renfrewshire West held in the Town Hall, we have seen the welcome return of such functions. The Ball has been well supported by the brethren of the Province in the 2 years that it has run. No XII has played its part with the Lodge having 4 tables on each occasion.

In the early part of the 20th Century, No XII held a number of 'At Home' functions. I am altogether unsure of the precise nature and format of these but there was certainly food, refreshment and music involved! One such was held in the Town Hall saloon on Wednesday 20th March 1912. It was an event that involved a great deal of planning and the involvement of many brethren in sub-committees. In the end, 70 people attended £27.12/- was spent and there was a deficit of 11/-. With the true class and style that is characteristic in the traditions of No XII, this deficit was wiped out by the Committee members contributing 6d each!! Details are below

Regarding 'At Home' fixed for 20th March

In connection with the 'At Home', the RW Master stated that the date suggested at the Executive meeting was 12^{th} March , but as the Saloon was engaged for that date, it was agreed to fix Wednesday 20^{th} March.

Monday 12th Feby. 1912

At a meeting of the 'At Home' Committee held in the Ladies Room on Monday 12th Feby. 1912 at the Close of Lodge Meeting

Bro John J Park, RW Master, presided

... the following Sub Committees were agreed to :- Programme, Music and General arrangements; Buffet and Refreshments; Decorations; Floor Committee ...

It was agreed that Bro Hamilton Young should get quotations for the purveying of the Buffet from Messrs. Jas. Service and Sons, Arch Brown and Son and HW Miller to report.

The purveying of the licensed Refreshment Bar was offered to, and accepted by, Bro. John Lyle on the understanding that the Committee have no responsibility other than 7/6, being one half of cost of special licence.

In connection with the Decorations, it was agreed that Messrs. M Hodge and Sons and Robt Blair and Son should be asked to offer. That Bros Ritchie and McCowat give an idea of what was required. The sum not to exceed £4.10/-.

Bro HW Jones and the Secretary were instructed to make inquiry regarding the supply of Music, the number of musicians and cost to be on similar lines to last year.

It ws agreed that complimentary invitations be sent to Provost WB McMillan; the Masters of the Sister Lodges in the Province; Bros W Munro Denholm, Glasgow, John Miller No 437 and Wm. Falconer of 'Glasgow News'.

Tuesday 14th May 1912

The 'At Home' Committee met at the Close of foregoing Meeting when the following statement was submitted of 'At Home' held on Wednesday 20th March '12

There is a detailed statement, the summary of which is that expenditure was £27.12/-, income was £27.1/-, leaving a deficit of 11/-. The deficit was covered by a levy of 6d on 22 members of Committee. 70 tickets were sold.
