### **Annual Meeting and Passing by Glasgow Kilwinning Lodge No 4**

The Annual Meeting of the Lodge will take place on Tuesday and will be followed by a Passing. The meeting will start at the earlier time of 715 pm with visitors admitted from 745pm.

The Passing will be conferred by Glasgow Kilwinning Lodge No 4. As far as I am aware, this will be the first time that Glasgow Kilwinning Lodge No 4 has conferred a Degree in No XII and the Brethren will be very welcome when they join us.

Of course, in recent times links have begun to develop between the Lodges. A significant catalyst has been the membership of No 4's Sister Lodge, The Prince's No 607, of some of our members – IPM Bro Alan D Beck is presently RWM of The Prince's and HM Bro Tony Stewart is RWM-Elect. Also, we have been pleased to see brethren from Lodge Glasgow Kilwinning No 4 visit us. Also, Bro David Vennard, presently RWM, delivered Tam o' Shanter at the No XII Burns Supper in 2015 and Bro Duncan McFadyen PM proposed the Toast to the Lassies in 2016.

I have the following information about the Glasgow Kilwinning Lodge No 4 from its website. The first Minute Book is held in the Mitchell Library and can be accessed by permission of the lodge. The Charter of the lodge, inscribed in pigskin, indicates the lodge was founded on the 1st of April, 1735, in John Henderson's tavern in the Gallowgate, Glasgow. John Clark was appointed as the first RWM by John Anderson of the lodge of Kilwinning held at Edinburgh. This is likely to be a reference to Canongate Kilwinning one of the 4 sponsor lodges which included lodges at Maybole, Peebles and Perth. A well-known Glasgow merchant John Murdoch was admitted on that night into a lodge which clearly had many members from the merchant class known colloquially as "the Tobacco Lords". Inspection of the boards of those Glasgow citizens who held the post of Lord Dean of Guild in the Merchants House in West George Street reveals many members of No.4.

A famous Glasgow and international historian Sir Archibald Alison, at one time Sheriff of Lanarkshire (in Glasgow) and an author and gentleman of repute, stated that the lodge was probably in existence at the start of the 18th century. That this is very likely is shown by the fact that at the very first meeting new members were Passed and Raised to the 3rd Degree there being Master Masons present who were members and capable of undertaking the degree work necessary. This is an indication that "Speculative Masonry" was that practiced in the lodge. The lodge would not appear to have evolved from a practicing Masons craftlodge such as The Lodge of Journeymen Masons No.8 in Edinburgh.

Glasgow Kilwinning Lodge No.4 has been meeting since 1945 in the Trades Hall in Glassford Street, right in the heart of the city. It has earned the nickname of "a city-centre lodge". It has never wandered far from its birthplace just to the East of Glasgow Cross and during its 277-year history businessmen, both large and small, the professions, tradesmen and others have all been well represented, people who, we like to think, put the "go" in Glasgow, people who try to put something back into this still-great city of ours, be it in service to the city, service to the community or in its charitable giving.

# Lest We Forget Remembrance Service at the Well Park, Greenock Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> November at 1245

As is the usual custom, a wreath will be laid at the Remembrance Service in the Well Park on behalf of Lodge Greenock Kilwinning No XII by RWM Bro Allan I MacFeate. Brethren of the Lodge are encouraged to support the RWM, and the Act of Remembrance, by their attendance.



Of course, No XII lost 10 brethren in the Great War – Bros. George W Campbell, James Hannah, Henry Hay, Arthur Johnstone, Duncan MacFarlane, David RF Mackail, Alexander N Russell, Joshua H Sanders, James Ritchie Smith and Archibald L Barr - and their names are engraved on the Lodge Memorial Altar.

The Lodge Bicentenary Historical Sketch of 1928 has the following: A memorial to the members of the Lodge who fell in the Great War was unveiled and dedicated on Friday 31<sup>st</sup> March 1922. It took the form of an altar in Gothic design, made of Scottish oak. It stands about 2ft. 10 in. from floor level. The names, inscribed by sinking the background are Bros. George W Campbell, James Hannah, Henry Hay, Arthur Johnstone, Duncan MacFarlane, David RF Mackail, Alexander N Russell, Joshua H Sanders, James Ritchie Smith and Archibald L Barr. The ceremony was performed

by Bro. Sir Hugh Shaw Stewart, Bart., CB, Provincial Grand Master, who was accompanied by his Office Bearers. The reading of the Roll of Honour was carried out by Bro. RS Murray, Provincial Grand Secretary and the Last Post was sounded.. Bro Rev Duncan MacArthur, Lodge Chaplain, offered up the prayer of dedication and Bro Duncan C Kerr MC RWM accepted custody of the Altar.


As in previous years through the Grand Lodge of Scotland and Poppy Scotland, the Lodge is participating in the Masonic Lodges' Remembrance display of poppy crosses. The names of the 10 fallen Brethren on the Altar of No XII have been depicted on the crosses and the Brethren have been requested to sponsor a poppy cross in this regard.

### 3 Brethren of No XII Distinguished by being Decorated during their Service to King and Country


My repeated journeys through the Lodge minute books and records have led me to discover that 3 Brethren of No XII were decorated in the Great War viz. Bros, Duncan Campbell Kerr, Duncan Ferguson Dempster Neill and Sir Walter Guy Shaw Stewart. Bro DC Kerr was in the 1<sup>st</sup>/5<sup>th</sup> Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders and received the Military Cross, Bro DFD Neill served in the Royal Engineers and received the Distinguished Service Order and Bro Sir Walter Guy Shaw Stewart in the Coldstream Guards and was awarded the Military Cross. In the Great War, Bro Kerr held the rank of Lieutenant, Bro Neill Lieutenant Colonel and Bro Shaw Stewart Major, later being promoted to Lieutenant Colonel.

This discovery prompted me to seek to find out more and I have been grateful to my friend, and former colleague at Govan High School (where he was Librarian), Ian McCracken, for his expertise, assistance and time. Already there have been many hours of on-line research and a half day spent in the Mitchell Library in Glasgow. We plan visits to the Paisley Museum and Greenock's McLean Museum where History Curator Vincent Gillan has already been extremely helpful on-line. We are discovering fascinating information about all three Brethren and the journey continues. At some point in the future we shall be able to make our findings available to you in a format that is informative and interesting. In the meantime, we should all be proud of the contribution made by these three Brethren.

Bro DFD Neill was RWM of No XII in 1905-06 and Bro DC Kerr in 1921-23. Bro Sir Walter Guy Shaw Stewart was Provincial Grand Master of Renfrewshire West from 1943 till 1967.

#### From the old Minute Books of No XII

#### Monday 28th April 1913

At a meeting of the Executive held in the adjacent

Light in Form of a Star

Bro John Lyle JD suggested the adoption by the Lodge of a light, in the form of a star, to be used in the conferring of the Master Mason Degree. He submitted a pattern of his idea and explained where it could be erected behind the Master's Chair, but, after discussion, it was agreed that we continue as at present.

It would seem to me that the Junior Deacon, Bro John Lyle, had a good idea which was rejected! Did it meet with opposition from the Past Masters? Was it considered to break with the 'traditions' of No XII? We shall never know the answers to these questions. However, what we do know that his idea must have been considered worthy at some time later for we certainly have such a star and have had for all of my 42 years in the Lodge!

### The way we were

The last Twelve Talk, with the photo (below) supplied by Past Master Bro Alistair Glenny led us to get in touch with the late Past Master Bro Bill Irving's youngest daughter Mhairi through IPM Bro Alan Beck. Actually, Mhairi and I were in school in Greenock High together. Having now been in touch with her by email, I know that she was delighted to receive the photo from us and is going to look out some photos she has of her Dad associated with No XII. These will be a welcome addition to our archives. She is also providing some interesting information about her Dad, his working life, his interests and how important No XII was to him. Further to that I had a letter from Luncarty from our senior Past Master Bro Alex More who was in the Chair immediately before Bill. Bill's term started in November 1975.
