Well our esteemed Past Master and knowledgeable Archivist has set about doing just that. On Tuesday February 6th 2018 Iain White PM used his well-honed presentation skills to expand on the topic

From No XII to the King Emperor by way of the Scotts and the Cairds

As a young Right Worshipful Master back in 1983 I often looked at the Lodge Charter Box and wondered at the early beginning of this major part of the working of the Lodge. I often read the words inscribed on it "made from casemate armour from HMS Argyll" and reflected on that ship's relationship with our town of Greenock.




We were taken through, in interesting detail, by Iain, the building and launch in 1904 of this great Ship and the influence and contributions Shipbuilding families of Scotts and Cairds had on Freemasonry and on Greenock Kilwinning Number X11 in particular.

The Lodge has benefitted greatly from C C Scott, R L Scott, and the Caird Brothers in monetary and fabric donations over the years. Iain gave a detailed account of such donations, some of which are, just like the Charter Box, in regular and meaningful use in our assemblies.


We were then reminded of HMS Argyll's escort duties to the Royal Yacht Medina during the King's visit to the Delhi Durbar of 1911-12. This then led Iain into expanding on such an assembly with attendees whose magical titles included Maharajas, Nizams, Nawabs, and Memsahibs. So, the link from HMS Argyll to Royalty and The British Empire constantly rests on the Right Worshipful Master's Dias securing our Lodge Charter dating back to 1737.

The lecture was a resounding success and no doubt has set the standard for future such meetings which can only encourage further study, and interest, in those who follow as promoters of the art of Freemasonry universal.

On behalf of the Right Worshipful Master, Office Bearers and Brethren of the Lodge and the assembled Brethren and Visitors, on the evening, I would like to thank Iain for his research and the professional manner in which it was delivered.



HMS Argyll built by the Scotts in Greenock




HMS Medina built by the Cairds in Greenock




The plaque inside the Charter Case lid

The Mark Degree in 1918 must have been quite something with 69 candidates. There was also a wedding gift presented to Bo RC Smith PM. This is the RC Smith whose shoe business has developed into the big shop in West Blackhall street which now sells sports equipment and clothing, school uniforms, highland dress and the like – as well as shoes. The meeting ended with a Harmony which included some speeches – a practice that continued at the Mark Degree till the early part of this century.

The Mark Degree was conferred upon 69 brethren – 65 of whom are from Lodge Greenock Kilwinning and 4 from Sister Lodges.

Thereafter, the Lodge was reduced to the EA Degree, and the RWM having resumed his Chair the brethren were called to Harmony.

A short toast list was submitted by the RW Master and the enthusiastic reply of Bro Captain JW Nesbitt, RWM of Lodge Georgetown No 1170 to that of the Imperial Forces of the Crown was much appreciated.
