Deputation to Lodge Burns Dundonald No. 1759 Tuesday 30th April Mark Degree

No XII heads to Dundonald again on 30th April, this time to confer a Mark Degree. The relationship between the two Lodges goes back to 2011 just before Bro. Alan D. Beck was in the Chair. Alan was singing in New York and met No XII member, Bro. Barry Banks, and they visited the Grand Lodge of New York building. As they waited for the tour to begin, they overheard a Scottish accent and they began talking to the owner of that voice - it was Bro. Steven Mack PM of Lodge Burns Dundonald. Alan invited Stevie to visit No XII and he attended with a Deputation of Brethren from Lodge 1759. Within a year, Bro Alan was in the Chair and No. XII and 1759 were exchanging Degrees.

Sadly, Bro Steven Mack has since passed to The Grand Lodge Above.

The Way We Were

A wee while ago, the late Past Master Bro. Wilson J. McCulloch's sister Anita gave me some papers and memorabilia covering Bro. Wilson's time in the Craft. I am sorting them out just now and putting together a presentation file in which they can be stored and readily accessed. It is interesting to look at the brethren in the Office Bearers photo and think about where their Masonic journeys took them. Of the 24 in the photo, there are 4 Past Masters. Another 8 took the Chair of No. XII in the years to come. Sadly, 9 of the total are now in the Grand Lodge Above. Of the 15 still with us, 9 still attend the Lodge with some degree of regularity.

Bro. Thomas Murray Gray 1924 - 2016

It was back almost a year ago on 14th May 2018 that this story started. Grand Secretary received an email from a Mr Robin Gray saying, "I am sorry to bother you, but I would like some advice, please. I was recently clearing out my late father's house, when I discovered, I assume, his apron. It looks in very good condition and I was wondering what to do with it?" Having described his Father's apron to Grand Secretary and sent a photo of it, our Lodge Secretary Bro Ken MacDougall was advised of the situation in the following email: "I attach an email from Mr. Robin Gray. You will observe from the previous emails that his Father, was a member of Lodge Greenock Kilwinning, No. 12 and I have suggested that he wish to return his Father's Regalia to his Mother Lodge. I should be most grateful if you would contact Mr. Gray with a view to being of assistance. Your assistance in this matter is greatly appreciated."

Bro Ken made an initial acknowledgement to Robin who advised us that his Father's date of birth was 27th March 1924. This fitted with information in the Roll Book. Ken also passed the correspondence to me. In turn, I contacted Robin saying, "As the Lodge Archivist, I have been passed your email by the Lodge Secretary. In the Lodge Greenock Kilwinning No XII Roll Book, Thomas Murray Gray Jr, a library assistant, joined on December 23rd, 1947 at the age of 23. His birthplace is recorded at Greenock and his place of residence Greenock too when he joined. He got his second degree on 16th March 1948 and his third degree on 20th April 1948. He was proposed by Bro. William B Wilson and seconded by Bro. John McNicol, (who it turns out) was

Thomas's cousin. Actually, when he joined, two of the other 4 candidates on that evening were people that I knew personally viz. Hugh Fullarton who was my Mum's insurance agent for many years and Tommy Ferguson whom I know through attending the Old West Kirk as he did. Both passed away some years ago - they would be 100+ now if still alive!!"

We exchanged another couple of emails and I asked Robin for some details about his Father's life. Ken had promised that we would do a feature in *Twelve Talk* about Bro Thomas and Robin sent us this brief biography of his Dad: "My Dad attended Ladyburn Public School until 1938. Then, Greenock High School till 1940. From 1947-1948, he attended the Scottish School of Librarianship in Glasgow. He lived in Fintry Road and Burnhead Street. He had a sister, Flora and brother, Daniel who lived in Bridgend Road area.

His career in Libraries began in 1940 when he worked at the Central Library, Wallace Square in Greenock. This was interrupted for his National Service. He was a Sergeant Navigator in the



RAF and was on his way to active service when the War finished. He returned to Greenock Library as Branch Librarian, then took up a position with the Mobile Library Service in the Morpeth area of Northumberland from 1950-52. It was here he met his wife, Marjorie. In 1952, my Dad took up a position at the Carnegie Library in Coatbridge. He spent several years in Coatbridge and started a family. During the early 60s, he moved to Maryburgh to take up the post of County Librarian at Dingwall Library. His final position before retiring was Highland Regional Librarian.

His interests out of work were gardening, model railways and his family. Our home in Maryburgh had a large garden in which he spent a lot of his spare time growing various vegetables and flowers. His potting shed was where he had his model railway layout.

As far as his Freemasonry activity goes, I'm afraid the first I knew was when I found the apron and other memorabilia. I am aware of a lodge in Dingwall. Perhaps, he attended there. The attached photo was taken at my wedding in 1997."

In amongst these emails, Robin sent us his father's apron and other bits and pieces of memorabilia. These were Catalogued by Bro.

Alistair Glenny PM as follows:

- A well-kept copy of Bethune's Ritual
- GLOS Laws & Constitution
- 1951 Version of "The Scottish Freemasons' Calendar"
- Booklet relating to Royal Arch Chapter No 15 ("Land o' Cakes) Eyemouth
- Annual Installation of No XII held on 7th December 1948
- A "Funeral Lodge" Order of Service from Renfrew County Kilwinning No 370 of 12-01-1950

- Detail of Divine Service at 217 dated 12-02-1950
- A well-preserved No12 Apron
- Consecration Service and By-Laws relating to Librarius Lodge No. 6966 which came into being on 22nd September 1950

Amongst the memorabilia a couple of things stand out. The Land o' Cakes Royal Arch booklet may have originated from the time when Thomas worked in Morpeth which is just less than an hour's drive from Eyemouth. I checked with Bro. Sandy Reddy, and Bro Thomas did not become a member of Greenock Royal Arch Chapter No. 17. So maybe he joined in Eyemouth?

This Royal Arch Chapter has an interesting history. In company with his good friend Robert Ainslie, Robert Burns received the Royal Arch Degree from the 'Land of Cakes' Royal Arch Chapter No.15 at a meeting held within the temple of Lodge St. Ebbe No.70, on 19th May 1787, at Eyemouth. Burns met Ainslie in early 1787 and Ainslie accompanied the poet on the first part of his Border tour in May of that year.

As to the Lodge Librarius, we can only assume (from its name) that it had some professional connection for Bro. Thomas. It still meets and has 4 meetings scheduled for Mumbai Square in London for 2019. I made an online enquiry of the United Grand Lodge of England for information about the Lodge but, unfortunately, received no response.



One look at the photo of Bro Thomas's masonic memorabilia (above) will cause the eyebrows to raise. Firstly, the Lodge number is given as 12 and not XII although, in the past, this was very common. More so is the colour of the apron being light blue rather than royal blue. I have never seen this before. I have no explanation!

Bro. Thomas Murray Gray passed to The Grand Lodge Above on 3rd August 2016.

We are grateful to Bro Thomas's son Robin for sending the memorabilia to the Lodge and for all the information that he has provided about his Dad. The memorabilia will be filed and stored in the Lodge archives.

Bro Alistair Glenny PM Much deserved recognition from the Grand Master Mason



It is often said that the principles of the Craft dictate that one of the most important roles and offices is in the Lodge is that of Almoner. It is a role that not everyone can fulfill. It demands a person who had a great deal of empathy, is expressing capable of sympathy and support as the situation demands. is conscientious and is held in high esteem by his brethren. One such is Bro Alistair Glenny PM and both No. XII, and the Provincial Grand Lodge Grand Lodge of Renfrewshire West, are fortunate to have Bro. Alistair as Almoner. His sterling work was recognised by the Grand Master Mason in November when he received the Honorary Grand Rank of Almoner.

At the meeting on 5th February, the Provincial Grand Master, Bro Robin McIntyre and our own RW Master, Bro Bob Crossan,

presented Bro Alistair with the Jewel and Certificate of Honorary Grand Almoner accompanied by suitable words of appreciation. Never has an honour been so well deserved.

From the Old Minute Books Gifts to Members in April and May 1920

In April and May 1920, No XII was involved in presenting gifts to a couple of members.

Tuesday 6th April 1920

Marriage of RW Master

Bro. Robert Thexton IPM referred to the marriage of the RW Master which took place on Saturday 3rd April and read a telegram which had been received from him in response to one sent conveying the good wishes of the Lodge.

It was suggested that in the absence of Bro. Macpherson, advantage could be taken for the Lodge to vote a sum of money for the purchase of a wedding gift and on the motion of Bro. Dan. W. Sinclair, seconded by Bro. James Currie, it was unanimously agreed to make a grant of £25.

The exact amount – more or less about that figure – and the arrangements for the presentation to be left with the Committee.

Presentation to Bro CJ Nancarrow BB

Owing to the transfer to London of Bro CJ Nancarrow BB, the Lodge presented him with a gold Lodge Jewel and a Lady's handbag for Mrs. Nancarrow.

Bro Thexton, in making the presentation, referred to the great interest Bro. Nancarrow had taken in the Lodge and, on behalf of the members congratulated him on his promotion.

Bro Nancarrow in accepting the gifts spoke of the regret it caused him to sever his connection with his Mother Lodge.
