Bro Ian Stewart Grant

The late Bro. Ian Grant was well known to us in No XII. I have featured pieces on his family and No. XII in a series of previous editions. Whilst at sea, Ian joined the Craft in Malta – either the Scottish Constitution Lodge - St Andrew No 966, or the English Constitution Lodge - Lodge of St John and St Paul No 349. No XII records are unclear on his Mother Lodge. He affiliated to No XII in later years. On his return from sea he was a Refrigeration Engineer visiting shops and industrial premises maintaining freezers.



Ian was an enthusiastic Scout and served in the 32nd and 70th Troops as a Scout Master. He used to be a big noise in the Greenock and District Scout Gang Shows. The photo above is from the programme of the Greenock and District schout Gang Show of 1964 which I came across the other week whilst looking for something else. Amongst the cast, fourth row from the front, and 6th person in from the right (beside Producer Arthur Ferguson) is the same Ian Stewart Grant. The cheery smile is unmistakeable. I think the neckerchief he is wearing is of the 70th. This was some time before he joined No. XII.

Ian was a regular at the Lodge and used to sit in the centre of the front row on the North Side beside his sidekick Jimmy Nelson. Indeed, they both took office as Stewards at the Installation

in November 1998 and Ian continued in that role for 4 years until November 2002 when he became President of Stewards. He served in that capacity for one year.

Also, in the photo is a very young me - Iain White - the Cub in the front row, second in from the right. I went on to become RW Master of No. XII between 1989 and 1991. Further, the Scout on the extreme left in the back row is the late Alistair Glenny. Alistair was RW Master of No. XII between 1983 and 1985.

Just to complete the Masonic connection, the Cub beside me, and third in from the right in the front row, is Malcolm Sinclair who was RW Master of Lodge Crawfurdsburn Greenock No. 1121 between 2016 and 2018. One sketch that the pair were in was about trades and occupations. I was 'The Butcher" and Malcolm was 'The Doctor with the Little Black Bag.'



It was the custom to get the programmes signed. Funnily enough, Ian Grant and Alistair Glenny signed my programme beside one another (left). They had been near neighbours in Bow Road, of course.

The James Stirrat Adams PM Memorial Gavel Its History

MASONIC GIFTS. - We understand that previous to the ceremony of laying the foundation stone of Garvel Park Dock with Masonic honours, Brother James York presented the Greenock Kilwinning Lodge with a mallet, mounted with silver and bearing an appropriate inscription, for the use of the Master. The mallet is constructed of oak taken from one of the old piers of Stockwell Bridge (now replaced by the new Albert It has been under water for upwards Bridge). of 300 years, has become quite black, but is as firm as iron, and has taken a fine and lustrous polish. Brother George Galbreath presented two handsome mallets, ornamented with silver and bearing inscriptions, to be used by the wardens of Greenock St John's (No. 175). These voluntary gifts show an excellent spirit in both lodges.

As most will remember, the Lodge Master's Gavel was rededicated as the James S Adams Memorial Gavel back in 2013 in memory of our dearly loved Past Master (below) who was taken so suddenly, and unexpectedly, to The Grand Lodge Above.



My intrepid sidekick in trawling the internet in search of information relating to the history of No XII, Bro Brian McFadyen WSW, has now come up with a cutting from The Greenock Advertiser of 11th July 1871, (above) which tells us a bit about the Master's Gavel's history. (Part of the article should be of particular interest to the brethren of Lodge Greenock St. John's No. 175).

This comes from part of a period (1867 - 1873) where the No. XII Minute Books are missing, although we do have the Roll Book that tells us a little of what was happening in the Lodge during these years.

A quick search brought just a little information about Bro. James York who presented the gavel. A contractor by occupation, he affiliated to No. XII on 7th March 1865, his Mother Lodge being Lodge St. John Glasgow No. 3bis. His affiliation was recorded in the Minute (which we do have) as follows: "Brother York having signified his desire to be admitted as an affiliated Brother his election was carried unanimously." RWM Bro. John Fleming was in the Chair.

For the life of me, I cannot quite remember what the inscription on the gavel's silver band says. That is something else to check when access to the Town Hall saloon is possible!



The Master's Gavel is shown on the left, the photo taken from the Bicentenary Sketch published by the Lodge in 1928. Of course, it isn't really a gavel! Technically it is a maul. However, tradition in No. XII has us describe it as a gavel so that is what it is!!

Maybe, before 1871, an actual gavel was used. We'll never know ...

Lapel Badges


