

#### Bro. William John Gibson 1967 - 2022

Bro William John Gibson, or Billy as we knew him, was born on 16<sup>th</sup> January 1967 and sadly passed to the Grand Lodge above on 5<sup>th</sup> January 2022 at 54 years of age. Billy was a victim of COVID-19. He contracted the virus in November last year, was hospitalised and then in a coma on a ventilator for 6 weeks. The crematorium was filled beyond capacity for his funeral, with mourners standing outside. Our RW Master Brian McFadyen observed that brethren from many Lodges were present as well as Companions from several Royal Arch Chapters.

Billy was Initiated into Lodge Greenock Kilwinning No. XII on December 18<sup>th</sup>, 2001, Passed on 15<sup>th</sup> January 2002 and Raised on 19<sup>th</sup> March 2002 and took his Mark on 16<sup>th</sup> April 2001 His proposer was Bro. David Miller.

Billy joined the Royal Navy as a boy and then transferred to the Royal Engineers where he was very proud of his active service, at home and abroad. Having left the Forces, Billy joined the Scottish Prison Service in 1988, serving in Shotts, during the riots, and then later transferring to Greenock Prison. In the prisons he was known as "The Gibster".

His work pattern and family commitments prevented Billy from attending the lodge as much as he would have liked. In 2005 he married his wife, Anne and was always a devoted Dad to his daughters Amanda, Eve & Isla, a loving brother to Gwen and Carol and a devoted uncle and friend.

Apart from freemasonry Billy's other hobbies were gardening, archaeology, collecting Roman artefacts and fly fishing. He was always full of fun and had a very quick wit. A man for pranks and impersonations, some brethren will recall when No. XII organised a bus trip to Roslyn Chapel with all the sister lodges. Billy had the full coachload of brethren in tears of laughter from start to finish. If you ever had time to spend with Billy, even for 1 hour only, he would tell you all about the history of wolves in Canada, his Roman coin collection and the difference between oose and fluff! He was a font of all knowledge and a well-loved Masonic brother. As Billy would always say, "Je m'appelle Le Gibster.... you may have heard of me?"

Billy has joined The Grand Lodge Above far too soon, but it will certainly be enhanced (and cheerier) with him amongst the brethren. He will be sadly missed by all who knew him, and our thoughts and prayers are with his family at this sad time.

### Annual Installation 16th November 2021

Instituted on 27th December 1728, Lodge Greenock Kilwinning No XII is the oldest and longest surviving organisation in Inverclyde. Recently, No XII held its Installation Ceremony. Bro Brian McFadyen was installed into the Chair as Right Worshipful Master in the Saloon of the Town Hall. The RWM of Lodge Doric Kilwinning No 68 led the deputation of visiting brethren, as is the tradition. In this case the man at the head was Bro James Hamilton. The Installing Masters were Bro Iain White PM, Bro Kenneth K Morrison PM and Bro Hector Macphail PM, all Past Masters of No XII. This was the first Installation in the Province of Renfrewshire West for nearly 2 years because of the COVID pandemic and attracted a huge number of brethren from within and beyond the Province.

At the Harmony in the Saloon around 100 brethren enjoyed dinner and the usual Loyal and Masonic Toasts were observed. Bro Brian McFadyen RWM toasted

Her Majesty the Queen. His Toasts to The Grand Lodge of Scotland and The Provincial Grand Lodge of Renfrewshire West were replied to by Bro Robin McIntyre, Right Worshipful Provincial Grand Master. Past Master Bro Robert J Bain PSGW, himself an army veteran, delivered a heartfelt toast to Her Majesty's Forces. The Right Worshipful Master, Bro McFadyen toasted the Installing Masters. The reply to these came from Principal Installing Master Bro. Iain White PM PPSGW. Bro A. Campbell Snoddy WSW toasted the Visiting Brethren and, as is traditional in No XII, the reply was given by Bro James Hamilton RWM of Lodge Doric Kilwinning No 68. The stewards were toasted by Bro Alexander R Johnson WJW.

As is the custom in No XII, Inverclyde Council was represented at the Installation Dinner and Harmony. On this occasion, the brethren were delighted that Provost Martin Brennan attended. Provost Brennan addressed the assembled brethren and spoke of the long and close connection between No XII and the town of Greenock and he especially highlighted the charitable work carried out by the Lodge. He was very appreciative of being invited to nominate a charity to be one of the beneficiaries each year. In 2021-22, Provost Brennan's nomination is Children in Poverty Inverclyde whose founder Pat Burke is a great friend of the Lodge. Provost Brennan concluded as he extended his good wishes to the new RWM and to the Lodge for the forthcoming session and expressed thanks for its support for the community. He received an enthusiastic standing ovation from the assembled brethren.

Bro Brian McFadyen RWM spoke of his pleasure at taking the chair and how honoured he felt. It would be his intention to support the Lodges who had supported tonight's Installation with a visit in the year ahead. He also spoke of the plans that he had for the Lodge, although there is still a degree of uncertainty brought about by the pandemic. A major charity drive is again under way. The RWM's late father, Bro John McFadyen, was a Lodge stalwart for many years. Bro Brian is a Past Master of The Lodge of Erskine No. 1566 although his Mother Lodge is No. XII.

The extremely happy evening finished with the singing of Auld Lang Syne and three hearty cheers!
