## Installations

Well, it's 'Steak Pie Season' again or, put another way, the run of Annual Installations is under way. From October to December, we have the succession of Friday nights, the occasional Saturday, and in our case in No XII Tuesday evening ceremonies. I went to my first Installation way back, just after my Raising in 1974 and it's been all downhill since then!

It's a strange ritual really. You go along to a meeting and then, often at some unearthly hour, sit down to kind and generous hospitality in the shape of a three-course meal that you certainly don't need. If you are weak-willed like me, this is often accompanied by more refreshments than is sensible and a slower than usual start to the following day.

Already this year I have been to 3-2in the Craft and 1 in the Royal Arch. I have witnessed worthy masons being installed into the Chair by very Installing **Teams** whose precision in, and understanding of, the Ritual associated with the Ceremonies has been commendable. I plan to be at another 6 at least – and I am not a Master, Warden nor an active Provincial Office Bearer, all of whom have many more on their schedules. It takes a fair degree of stamina.

Over the years, I can remember having to buy (at least) 4 morning suits as the excesses of food and refreshment resulted in my girth forever expanding. Even if I had attended just 3 installations, on average. each year that is around 144 steak pie dinners I didn't need. How much money would I have saved in morning suits if I had had afewer steak pie dinners? Ah well, as a famous radio pundit would say, "It's all ifs and buts!"

One thing has struck me increasingly as the years have gone on is the amount of time that many Installations take. Don't get me wrong, as so many of you have experienced, I can blether with the best of them! However, I am trying to do better and you can let me know how I do this year!

I do have some questions to ask that may be a bit contentious. (1) Do Installing Boards need to be out for so long? Could they not be ready and waiting to return as soon as the work inside is finished? (2) How about a 'bullet point approach' to The Aims and Relationships of the Craft instead of the present encyclopaedic version with its out-of-date language? (3) Should more consideration be given installations being done completely in the Lodge with no Board? This was the historical approach in No. XII and we shall use it again this year.


The Annual Charity Drive is a very important part of our work in No. XII. This year, from the Burns Supper and other activities, the Lodge raised £4,500 to distribute. As usual, Inverclyde's Provost (Martin Brennan at the time) was invited to nominate a Charity. We were delighted when he chose our old friends at Children in Poverty Inverclyde and Pat Burke came along to receive the cheque for £1500. In the present situation in our society unfortunately more and more people are becoming dependent upon support from foodbanks. We responded to this by giving £1000 to Inverclyde Foodbank. I was asking if she had any photos or other memorabilia from Roy's time in No XII. Roy of course was a very highly regarded mason. He was a local dentist. His Dad Bob Drainer was also a highly esteemed Past Master of No. XII. Bob was a teacher of Classics by profession and went on to become Headteacher at Gourock High School and then Camphill High in Paisley.

Roy used to provide the music at our ceremonials. He played an old-fashioned American Organ that operated through the medium of big foot pedals – hard and challenging work! Roy was the consummate floor worker. Clarity, precision and sincerity were his hallmarks. He was also a

Anyway, back Barbara. The COVID crisis had intervened but recently she called me to say that she had found some photos. I went up to collect them from her and we had a great chat over old times and how the Lodge is doing going into the future. turned out that Barbara had unearthed a bit of a treasure chest for us.

A careful look at the Provost will tell that his Chain of Office is the original which was mysteriously stolen from the Town Buildings sometime later. Never recovered, it had to be replaced. In these days, it was the custom that the Provost, as the First Citizen, would invite

the RW Master and his Installing Masters for hospitality in his room immediately after the Installation Ceremony. We are delighted that this practice is to be reinstated this year.

Of those in the photo, Bro Alex More is our Senior Past Master but being resident in Helmsdale is unable to be at our meetings; Bro KK Morrison PM is still a stalwart, of course. Sadly, all the others have passed to the Grand Lodge Above.
