How many of us pack away our ideals along with our aprons at the end of each meeting to remain locked in our cases until the next meeting. Do we always strive to take our morals and teachings into our daily lives? I wonder if there is a need for us also to adopt a 24/7 attitude to our freemasonry and strive to practice outside of the lodge those excellent precepts that we are taught within.

Perhaps we should try to open our eyes to the wonders of the world around us; open our hearts to the needs of others; open our minds to be receptive to new ideas: Perhaps after all, we could learn a lesson from old Arkwright and be a bit more *Open all Hours*!

#### **Brother David Fleming**

Past Master of Lodge Inverkip Ardgowan No. 1425, Past Provincial Grand Treasurer

Brother David passed to higher service in the Grand Lodge above on Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> October and his funeral took place on Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> October and was well attended by his many friends in freemasonry. A quiet and unassuming man, Brother David was very active in his Mother Lodge of Lodge Inverkip Ardgowan No. 1425 and served as its Right Worshipful Master on two separate occasions and was a member of the lodge for over 50 years.

He was instrumental in ensuring that the finances of the Lodge were always in excellent shape as he applied his skills as an accountant to good use as Treasurer of the lodge for many years.

#### Test Fees:

Please be reminded that it is important that Test Fees are kept up to date. Most Lodges now offer the facility of paying by direct debit which is an excellent way of ensuring that you are always clear in your Lodge. In particular, it is also important to make sure that if you are an affiliate member of another Lodge, you must be clear in ALL Lodges in which you are a member to ensure that you may continue to visit other Lodges. Brethren who are not up to date in all Lodges have visiting rights withdrawn as well as the privileges which would normally be afforded to them in their Mother Lodges.

#### Capitation:

Brethren should be aware that the Capitation Fee has now been increased to £30 per active member as per the recent membership return. This is the first increase in three years and it is hoped that, if approved, this rate will be fixed for a three-year period. It may be appropriate for some Lodges to now consider whether their TEST FEES continue to be at an appropriate level.
