What I do notice though is that unlike the older people I meet, the young folk that I pass on my daily route, will pass by without a glance, their heads bowed, their eyes glued to the screens of their phones and their ears plugged with their earphones as they listen to their music.

I feel like shouting at them to let them know what they are missing in the way of natural beauty and entertainment. Not for them, the glorious sight of the early morning sun over the Cowal hills and the mountains beyond. Not for them the sound of the blackbird singing far more sweetly than anything that can be downloaded from YouTube or wherever. These things are simply not appreciated. They are taking for granted.

However, if I am realistic, we are probably all a bit like that and we take many of God's gifts for granted. Our health, the fact that we live in comfortable warm and secure houses, the fact that we do not need to worry too much about where the next meal is coming from.

We assume that when we go to bed each night that we will wake up the following morning and that at the end of the day, we will safely once more tuck ourselves into a comfortable bed. I wonder if that was less of a certainty, would be appreciate life and all its riches a little more. One day our reckoning will come!

It's not as if we do not get constant reminders of such how painful life can be; simply turn on the news and consider the people in Aleppo and take a moment to consider their position. I suspect, they will simply appreciate being still alive at the end of each day.

Perhaps taking a few moments at the end of each day and thanking God for all the blessings we enjoy while praying for others would be worthwhile.

Perhaps we should also take a moment to appreciate our freemasonry. I occasionally hear complaints about test fees and membership fees but I would simply ask you what other organisation offers the opportunity to develop such trusted and often lifelong friendships.

That is something that you cannot put a price upon. Now that is something to be appreciated.

One small point Brethren in that it was agreed prior to the very first Ball back in 2014, the event was for members of the Craft and their partners only.


Grand Lodge.

Worshipful Master between 2011 to 2013 as well as being an Honorary Member of Lodge Greenock Kilwinning No. XII, Lodge Sir Michael No. 989, Lodge Crawfurdsburn No. 1121, Lodge International No. 1508, Gibson Masonic Lodge No. 87 (IC) and an Honorary Member (Only the 3rd ever) of the Provincial Grand Lodge of Dunbartonshire. The list of his participation in all of the other Orders to which he is dedicated is too long to be included in this short report suffice to say that when we say Freemasonry is Universal Brother Galbraith really takes that to heart and has been all over the World flying the flag for Lodge Greenock St. John's No. 175 and the Province of Renfrewshire West.

Brother Marshall North IPM then came from East to West, assisted by Substitute Grand Master Brother George Russell Kelly, and presented Brother Alexander Galbraith PM with his Jubilee Certificate to commemorate 50 years membership of his Mother Lodge.

Brother Galbraith replied with a few words of thanks to the Brethren of the Lodge and the Visiting Brethren, many from outwith our Province, for the honour bestowed upon him stating it has been a great privilege to be a Member of the Lodge, and the Craft, with many fond and happy memories recalled over the past 50 years with friendships continuing to grow.
