Dear Brethren,

I begin with an apology as due to the fact that I have managed to find some time to take Mrs L for a wee break before the winter sets in and the Installation season gets into full swing, I found it difficult to find enough time to compile an editorial this month although last month's seems to have stirred a few thoughts. It is nice to hear that you have enjoyed an article and indeed even if you have disagreed with what has been said, don't be afraid to tell me as at least it shows it has been read. So this month, I have taken the liberty of using an extract from a Divine Service which I conducted back in 2007.

"Our Hymn of reflection this evening is "Abide with me" and might seem a strange choice to some, as it is often associated with funerals but let me tell you a little of the background to this wonderful hymn.

The inspiration for the hymn is found in the text from St. Luke's Gospel Ch 24:29 "They urged Him strongly, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening; the day is almost over".

The music is by William H Monk and was written in 1861. His wife described the setting as follows: "This tune was written at a time of great sorrow – when together we watched, as we did daily, the glories of the setting sun. As the last golden ray faded, he took some paper and pencilled that tune which has gone all over the earth".

The words are by the Reverend Henry Lyte, who was inspired to write the hymn while suffering from tuberculosis; he finished it the Sunday he gave his farewell sermon in the parish he had served for so many years. The next day, he left for Italy to regain his health but never made it as he died in Nice in France, just three weeks after writing these words.

In his farewell sermon he said, "*O brethren, I stand here among you today as alive from the dead, if I may hope to impress it upon you and induce you to prepare for that solemn hour which must come to us all, by a timely acquaintance with the death of Christ*".

For over a century, the bells of his church at All Saints in Lower Brixham, Devon, have rung out "Abide with me" daily.

Most are familiar with the words but there are in fact another three verses, which are unfortunately omitted from the traditional setting, which, to me, is a pity. Listen to the words.

Not a brief glance I beg, a passing word;
But as Thou dwell'st with Thy disciples, Lord,
familiar, condescending, patient, free.
Come not to sojourn, but abide with me.

Come not in terrors, as the King of Kings,
But kind and good, with healing in Thy wings,
Tears for all woes, a heart for every plea –
Come, Friend of sinners, and thus bide with me.

The third verse is almost Burnsian;

Thou on my head in early youth didst smile;
And, though rebellious and perverse meanwhile,
Thou hast not left me, oft as I left Thee,
On to the close, O Lord, abide with me.

The words make it clear that however much you lose your way in life, however much you give in to life's many temptations, however much it seems at times that life is against you, God is always there and all you have to do is reach out to Him. He gives us hope and certainty that at the close of the day He is still with us and gives us courage to face the greatest unknown.

Let us join together in singing, not a hymn of sadness, fear or submission but a hymn of faith, of hope, of victory. Abide with me.

Reminder - Advertising of meetings:

The Constitution and Laws of the Grand Lodge of Scotland provide for three ways in which to advertise Lodge meetings.

1. By intimation at the previous Regular Meeting.
2. By advertisement in the local newspaper published at least 48 hours prior to the meeting.
3. By circular delivered or posted to every qualified member at least 5 days prior to the meeting.

The above are the three permissible methods of convening meetings. It is not necessary to use all three; in fact, one method may be used for all meetings. The Lodge bye-laws must make clear which method will be used for any particular meeting.

For many years, the Provincial Grand Lodge of Renfrewshire West has compiled and published a composite advert in the Greenock Telegraph newspaper which has resulted in a significant saving to all Lodges over the previous practice of advertising meetings individually. However, due to the reducing readership of the Greenock Telegraph, it would appear to be the case that Lodges no longer consider this method of advertising to represent good value for money. One Lodge has already withdrawn from the composite arrangement and a further two are in the process of changing their bye-laws to effect a change.

As a result, it was agreed at the most recent meeting of Provincial Grand Committee that Lodges would be informed that the practice of advertising using a composite advert in the Greenock Telegraph would be discontinued from the end of the 2017 – 2018 session. This allows Lodges to fully consider the matter, determine what method they will use to advertise their meetings and allow a period of time to make appropriate alterations to their bye-laws.

In the event that Lodges determine that they wish to discontinue advertising in the Greenock Telegraph, it is recommended that the bye-laws should be altered to simply use option 1 above. This does not preclude the use of other means of advertising meetings such as the West column, Facebook, Lodges websites etc.

It is further recommended that in the event that a Lodge wishes to alter its bye-laws to reflect this change, consideration is given to any other changes which might be made at the same time such as fees etc. Finally, it is strongly recommended that before a change to Lodge bye-laws is submitted to the Lodge as a Notice of Motion, a draft is submitted to Provincial Grand Secretary for approval.

Byelaws and Notices of Motion:

Brethren, could I please urge you to ensure that any proposed changes to bye-laws be discussed with the Provincial Grand Secretary BEFORE compiling a Notice of Motion for submission to the Lodge. This will ensure that the Motion is in an acceptable format and avoid any delays caused by having to have the proposal reworded and resubmitted.

Renfrewshire 200 Club (RW200Club).

Application forms are also still available within each Lodge. If you have not already "signed up" I hope that you will give your earnest consideration to this excellent method of charity fund-raising which should at the same time, assist in boosting attendance figures throughout the Lodges. The monthly entry fee is £5.00. However, those wishing to participate are not limited to any number of "entries" and if anyone wishes to purchase two or more tickets they may do so. It is hoped that Lodges will also participate by purchasing tickets and perhaps this could be favourably considered by your General or Finance Committees.

Members may either pay cash (cheques should be made out to the Provincial Grand Lodge) or may take out a standing order arrangement. You can also take part on a monthly basis but to take part in the draw your contribution, whether by cash, cheque or standing order must be with the Provincial Grand Treasurer prior to the draw taking place.

Please remember that a minimum of 50% of the income will be going directly to charity.

The fund has enabled Provincial Grand Lodge to make charitable donations to the recipients of the Province's Citizen of the Year Award for the last three years and as reported fully below, the sum of £10,000 was presented to REACH for Autism, Inverclyde at the Province's annual Summer Ball. This supplements donations already made to the Girl Guides and Hammy's project in Port Glasgow and a proposal will be made at the Regular Communication in October, to dispose of the remaining funds prior to the new Commission taking over on the 1st February 2018.

Please be reminded that it is important that Test Fees are kept up to date. Most Lodges now offer the facility of paying by direct debit which is an excellent way of ensuring that you are always clear in your Lodge.

In particular, it is also important to make sure that if you are an affiliate member of another Lodge, you must be clear in ALL Lodges in which you are a member to ensure that you may continue to visit other Lodges. Brethren who are not up to date in all Lodges of which they are a member, have visiting rights withdrawn as well as the privileges which would normally be afforded to them in their Mother Lodges.

Poppy Scotland.



At the October Regular Communication of Provincial Grand Lodge, it was agreed that a donation would be made to Poppy Scotland from the Provincial Grand Master's Charity Fund of £2,000 on behalf of the brethren of the Province of Renfrewshire West and that arrangements would be made at an early opportunity to present a cheque to the organisation. The brethren of Lodge Cumberland Kilwinning No. 217 were kind enough to allow such an opportunity at their Regular Meeting on Thursday 19th October.

We were delighted to welcome Brother Gordon Michie, Past Substitute Provincial Grand Master of Fife and Kinross and Past Master of Lodge Earl Haig No. 1260 along with accompanying brethren from his Lodge to the meeting. Brother Michie is the Head of Fundraising for PoppyScotland and had offered to deliver a talk on the work of his organisation.

What followed was an enthralling insight into the history of Lodge Earl Haig and the background to the work of the organisation from its creation to the present day. The Lodge was well filled on the evening and from the many complimentary comments received it was clear that the talk had been very well received.

It was a very pleasant duty to be able to present the cheque to Brother Michie on behalf of the freemasons of Renfrewshire West and I would only add that if any Brother missed the meeting on Thursday night, they could do worse than watch for an opportunity to hear Brother Michie's talk at some point in the future. As one well-known and very experienced Brother said to me at the close of the meeting. It was one of the best talks he had heard given in the Province.

A huge vote of thanks is extended to Brother Michie for taking the time to travel all the way through from Fife on a fairly unpleasant evening to bring a little light from east to west!
