Just over 170 sat down in the Greenock Town Hall on Saturday 27th February to a sumptuous meal prepared and served by our President of Stewards, Tony Buckley's staff from I.C.E Catering. Having demanded admission, the Haggis was piped in by Lodge Piper Bro Alasdair Beaton PM and addressed in lusty fashion by Bro Alan D Beck IPM. In charge of proceedings from the Chair was Bro Ian M Ross PM and he kept things moving along in his usual efficient and good humoured way. #### From the old No XII Minute Books

#### Tuesday 7th January 1913

Bro RC Smith, RW Master, in the Chair

Bro Sir Hugh Shaw Stewart's name suggested as Provincial Grand Master

An intimation from Grand Lodge was read suggesting that Sir Hugh Shaw Stewart's Commission as Provincial Grand Master of Renfrewshire West would expire in February next. It requested that the matter be considered in open Lodge and the name of a brother be sent to Grand Secretary not later than 18<sup>th</sup> inst.

Bro John J Park IPM moved that the name of Bro Sir Hugh Shaw Stewart be put forward and this was unanimously agreed to.

These, of course, were the days when the Shaw Stewarts were the 'hereditary' provincial Grand Masters of Renfrewshire West.
