Ivan Cyril Scott 1st September 1930 – 1st March 2017



Bro Ivan passed to his rest and reward just over a year ago. It has taken some time, but now the information has been gathered to do justice to him in an appreciation of his life and his time amongst us. Bro Jain White PM

Bro Ivan Scott PM hailed from Alfreton in the Amber Valley in Derbyshire. The town is said to have been founded by King Alfred and hence its name. His father was a miner and Alfreton had a thriving mining and iron industry until the 1960s. Young Ivan was not destined for the pits. When he left school, he became an apprentice joiner and worked as such until 1949 when he joined the Royal Marines for his National Service. He did his training at Chatham and was thereafter stationed in London. It was during this period that he started thinking seriously about joining the police and did so, in the Nottingham City force, after his spell in the Marines. It is said that during his time on the Nottingham police, he

came in from a foot patrol on a cold, damp winter's evening and saw an advertisement for the Hong Kong Police Force. On 18th August 1955, Ivan landed in Hong Kong!

Ivan started as Sub-Inspector and the Hong Kong Police was his life for the next 32 years. For many of these, he was stationed in the New Territories tackling illegal immigration from China. Ivan loved the countryside and his visits to the villages where he got to know the local people and was made very welcome.

In 1963, he met his wife Margaret who was from Gourock and, an adventurer like Ivan, was in Hong Kong working as a teacher. They were married on 23rd January 1965 in St John's Church, Gourock. In due course they were blessed with their three sons, Robb, Craig and Dirk.

Ivan progressed through the ranks in the course of a successful career in the Hong Kong Police. In the early 1970s, he received a commendation for tackling corruption in the prisons; in 1985 he was awarded the Colonial Police Medal for meritorious service by Her Majesty, the Queen; in 1987, he retired as a Senior Superintendent being the proud possessor of the Colonial Police Long Service Medal with First and Second Clasps.

Ivan led a very full life and, most of all, was devoted to his family which grew to embrace 5 grandchildren. His interests were many. He loved music – especially that of brass bands and the big bands that were all the rage in his earlier years. He was a sportsman. In his youth he had semi-professional trials with Nottingham Forest and as a tennis enthusiast he coached the Hong Kong junior Davis Cup teams.

Of course, we know Ivan best from the Lodge. He and Margaret came to live in Gourock in 1995. By this time his experience in freemasonry was extensive. Ivan was initiated into Lodge Shamrock No 712 (Irish Constitution) in Hong Kong on 21st January 1960 and was Worshipful Master thereof in 1970-71. He was an affiliate member of Lodge Cosmopolitan Hong Kong No 428 (SC) which he joined on 3rd December 1994. Bro Ivan was also an affiliate member of The Scots Lodge No 2319 (EC), our friends in London.

It was after his move to live in Gourock that Bro Ivan came amongst us in No XII. He affiliated on 3rd November 1998 because, as he told me once, he had 'visited a number of Lodges but I felt most at home in No XII'. This was followed through by his conscientious and committed membership, serving as Inner Guard for a number of years and as a General Committee member. In the latter years, even when he was experiencing pain and had difficulty walking, Bro Ivan and his stick would be found sitting in the South East of the Lodge, in the back row, just behind where I sat as Director of Ceremonies. I would always enjoy the wee chats that we had.

My fondest memory of Bro Ivan is one of our visits to the Scots Lodge. As usual, we had travelled down by the Caledonian sleeper. After a really enjoyable meeting with the brethren of Scots, and generous hospitality at the Dinner, we were getting back on to the sleeper and Bro Ivan said, 'I want you all to meet me in the Bar so that I can buy you a wee nightcap.' And, so he did, a lovely Speyside malt as I remember it and the usual convivial chat to accompany it into the wee sma' hours. Happy days!

After Bro Ivan's wife Margaret had passed to her rest and reward, he moved into a flat at Sir Gabriel Wood's Mariners' Home where he spent his last couple of years. True to form, he threw himself into researching Sir Gabriel Wood because he felt that he 'must have been a freemason.' We talked often and corresponded about his efforts, but Bro Ivan never proved his hypothesis.

Through the Colonial years in No XII, we had a number of brethren who went to the East and became eminent masons. Bro Ivan Cyril Scott was an eminent mason from the East who came our way and enriched the Lodge by his presence. An enthusiast, the sort of mason that we should all aspire to be and a true gentleman in every sense of the word we miss him, but we are so fortunate that he came our way.

From the old Minute Books of No XII

The Minute Book extracts below reflect that. Sadly, one refers to the loss of Bo Engineer Lt David Mackail whose name, of course, is on the Lodge Memorial Altar.

The RW Master referred to the illness of Bro John Barbour PM and expressed the hope that he would soon be better and able to continue his interest in the affairs of Greenock Kilwinning.

The RW Master also referred to the death of Bro Engineer Lt. David MacKail, one of our young members who early responded to his Country's Call by joining the Army and recently transferred his services to the Navy.

It was resolved that regret for his loss should be recorded in the minutes and that the sympathy of the Office Bearers and Members should be conveyed to his father – Bro John G MacKail who is an old Office Bearer – and the members of his family.
