


Just some more cleaning and TLC

Recess Read

It's that man Glenny again! I am grateful to Bro. Alistair Glenny PM for the following piece

No! The title does not refer to reading in the set-in bed in the hoose, wi a big roarin' fire burning in the living room, but my experience reveals some interesting facts in a book I have been reading during our "Masonic" recess.



The book is entitled ALEPPO the Rise and Fall of Syria's Great Merchant City by Author Philip Mansel

Philip Mansel is considered our greatest authority on the civilisation of the Levant and has written a concise and elegant elegy to one of the oldest, grandest, and cosmopolitan cities of the region. One literary review states that, the book will stand as a eulogy for the city.

Aleppo is in ruins, a casualty of Civil War, once regarded as a vibrant world city where people of differing religions lived and traded together in peace. It was the third largest City in the Ottoman Empire to Constantinople and Cairo

Part 1 of the book considers the History from Ottoman rule through the French Mandate and on towards Syrian Independence.

Part 2 is a compendium of narratives entitled THROUGH TRAVELLERS' EYES and my attention was particularly drawn to a Chapter entitled "The Natural History of Aleppo" (1756) Alexander Russell.

Educated in Edinburgh, Alexander Russell qualified as a Doctor and became physician to the Merchants in Aleppo. His book, The Natural History of Aleppo, became a reference source detailing demographics, life and commerce, and the animals, birds and plants, of the area, supported with a large number of prints. A second larger edition was published by Alexander's brother Patrick. The first edition however was dedicated to the British Consul in Aleppo, at that time, our very own Past Master and Scotland's first Provincial Grand Master Mason, Alexander Drummond.

Each Year at the Installation of Right Worshipful Master of Lodge Greenock Kilwinning No XII reference is made to Alexander Drummond His Majesty's Consul in Aleppo, as the incoming Master is invested with what has become affectionately known as "The Drummond Medal" presented to the Lodge by Drummond, marking his Masonic achievements.

And so it was, that not only did Alexander Drummond propagate Freemasonry in that area, but with Russell's help established a Masonic lodge in Aleppo we know as Union Drummond no 59, on St. Andrews Day 1747, which according to the Author "may have contributed to the city's spirit of coexistence" There in Aleppo, Muslim, Christian, and Jew lived and worked in harmony for the benefit of the City - If only that was the case today!

The Way We Were – The Grants (Continued)

I am still working on the feature on the late Bros. Grant (Stewart and Ian) who were members of No. XII and lived in the Bow Road opposite our Bros. Glenny. As I said in the last 3 editions, it all began some time ago when Stewart's son Keith contacted Lodge Secretary Bro. Ken MacDougall PM and I am now involved in a flurry of emails with the Grant family. I am now in contact with another Grant – Euan – who is a cousin of Keith, Calum and Ian (The latter two are Ian's sons and Calum is a member of No XII). Just to keep your curiosity going on this one, I am publishing a little more information.

Bro Stewart Grant, Initiated into Lodge Greenock Kilwinning No. XII on 18th April 1944. This photo was taken after he had moved to Hong Kong. He worked there as a joiner in the Taikoo Dockyard. He became Worshipful Master of Cathay Lodge No. 4373 E.C. in 1962/63.



The photo of Bro Grant Stewart Worshipful Master of the Cathay Lodge in Hong Kong that we published in Issue 123 is shown again on the left. If you look at the brother sitting on the right-hand side of Bro. Grant, he looks very distinguished with his fine mop of silver hair.



In this photo, the distinguished looking brother is seen with WM Bro Stewart Grant. We can see that he is a past Worshipful Master and is wearing the jewel of Substitute Master of the Lodge.

Was the photo taken on the same occasion as the group photo? Was it the Installation? Was the distinguished looking brother an Installing Officer for Bro Stewart? Was he Stewart's friend as well as brother? Was he too an immigrant to Hong Kong?

We shall never know for sure, but it is interesting to ask the questions — well, it is for me as a sad old archivist at any rate! The unfortunate thing is that we shall never know the answers. If only Bro. Stewart had written some information on the back of the photo!!

(BTW this photo was taken at a different set of doors from the group photo. A closer look tells us that the panelling is different.)

Bro. Robert Leck (1936 – 14th July 2019)

Our RW Master, Bro Bob Crossan, received the email below from Bro Joseph Crumlish of Lodge Greenock St. John's No. 175. It concerns the passing to The Grand Lodge Above of Bro Robert Leck.

Dear Brother.

I write to inform you of the passing of one of you brethren, Robert Leck. He was initiated into Lodge Greenock Kilwinning No 12 in 1956 and served as a Steward and Inner Guard, before moving South in 1960. He was still an active freemason, most recently within Heritage Lodge No 5572 (Province of West Kent and United Grand Lodge of England, meeting at Oakley House, Bromley Common) up until his death on 14/7/2019. Robert was my late Father's cousin. I have recently joined Lodge Greenock St. John's No 175 and felt obliged to let Robert's Mother Lodge know this news. Notes on W.Bro. Bob Leck for 60 year citation (adapted from notes on his 50 year citation meeting 24.11.12.)

Bob was initiated into Freemasonry in 1956 joining Greenock Kilwinning Lodge no.12 under the Scottish Constitution.

Bob served as a Steward and I.G. before moving South in 1960 working for Camden Council as a Parks Superintendent.

As a National Serviceman Bob served his time in the R.A.F. Bomb Disposal unit but does not talk much about his time here.

As a long time P.I.G. Bob joined Elfrida Lodge no. 4497 in 2000 and rose through the ranks (2002 SD), (2003 JW) to become Master in 2005.

After vacating the chair Bob took up several stand - in roles including I.G. in 2006 and JW and Almoner in 2007.

When Elfrida Lodge unfortunately handed in their warrant in 2010 he and several of his buddies joined Heritage Lodge.

Bob was already a member of Heritage Chapter and here again he was always willing to step in especially as the Chapter was reasonable small and his dedication and enthusiasm was of great assistance.

Bob has long been a champion of Demelza House raising money holding 'open house' and garden parties. He has also been a keen supporter of local Scout Groups and upholds the Scout promise of 'always thinking of others before himself'.

Bob has been happily married to Maureen for 62 years and has a Son, David.

Bob has recently not been in good health and as such the presentation of his 60 year Citation would normally have been carried out by the PGM himself. At his request however Bob wanted as little fuss as possible and earlier today before the meeting his good friends and long term Masonic colleagues W.Bro Albert and Derek visited Bob at home and made this presentation on behalf of the PGM.

Throughout his adversities however Bob has always been, and still remains a keen supporter of Freemasonry and thoroughly deserves recognition for his long service.

We will all take wine with him at the Festive Board not only as an absent Brother but in celebration of this momentous occasion.

Friday 14th December 1923

Sword Bearer appointed (New office)

In addition to the Offices held in the Lodge, that of Sword Bearer has been added. The first holder of this Office is Bro. James Graham who, in recognition of the occasion, presented the Lodge with a handsome Claymore.

The jewel pertaining to this Office was presented by Bro. Robert Smith, secretary.

We still have this Claymore today some 96 years later.
