Our Previous Meeting Tuesday 19th November Annual Installation

The following was submitted to the Greenock Telegraph for publication.

Instituted on 27th December 1728, Lodge Greenock Kilwinning No XII is the oldest and longest surviving organisation in Inverclyde. Recently, No XII held its 292nd Installation Ceremony. Bro J. Robert (Bob) Crossan was installed into the Chair as Right Worshipful Master in the Town Hall Saloon. The RWM of Lodge Doric Kilwinning No 68 led the deputation of visiting brethren, as is the tradition. In this case the man at the head was Bro James Hamilton. The Installing Masters were Bro Iain White PM, Bro Kenneth K Morrison PM and Bro Alan D. Beck PM, all Past Masters of No XII.

At the Harmony in the main Town Hall the brethren enjoyed dinner and the usual Loval and Masonic Toasts were observed. Bro Bob Crossan RWM toasted Her Majesty the Queen. His Toasts to The Grand Lodge of Scotland and The Provincial Grand Lodge of Renfrewshire West were replied to by Bro John W Black, Right Worshipful Provincial Grand Master Depute. Past Master Bro Captain Allan I. MacFeate, himself a former Master Mariner in the Merchant Navy, delivered a heartfelt toast to Her Majesty's Forces whose theme was the poems of the two World Wars. The Right Worshipful Master, Bro Crossan toasted the Installing Masters.

The reply to these came from Principal Installing Master Bro. Iain White PM PPSGW. Bro Brian McFadyen WSW toasted the Visiting Brethren and, as is traditional in No XII, the reply was given by Bro James Hamilton RWM of Lodge Doric Kilwinning No 68.

As is the custom in No XII, Inverclyde Council was represented at the Installation Dinner and Harmony. On this occasion, the brethren were delighted that Provost Martin Brennan attended. Provost Brennan addressed the assembled brethren and spoke of the long and close connection between No XII and the town of Greenock and he especially highlighted the charitable work carried out by the Lodge. He was very appreciative of being invited to nominate a charity to be one of the beneficiaries each year and was pleased to be present when the cheque to his choice, Ardgowan Hospice was handed over. The Lodge awaits Provost Brennan's nomination for 2019-20. Provost Brennan concluded as he extended his good wishes to the new RWM and Lodge for the forthcoming session and expressed thanks its support for the community.

Bro Bob Crossan RWM spoke of his pleasure at taking the chair again and of the plans that he had for the Lodge in the year ahead. A major charity drive is again under way.

Musical contributions from Joanna Crossan, accompanied by Polly Beck on piano were much enjoyed by the company and gave a real family feel to the evening, Joanna being the daughter of the Right Worshipful Master and Polly being the wife of Bro Alan D. Beck PM. The extremely happy evening finished with the singing of Auld Lang Syne and three hearty cheers!

Scottish National War Memorial

An intimation from the Earl of Atholl PGM regarding the Scottish National war Memorial at Edinburgh Castle.

It was stated that the General Committee, on 5th October last, had agreed to take an offering on the evening when the members of Provincial Grand Lodge made their annual visit.

After further consideration, it was resolved to recommend the Lodge to guarantee the sum of $\pm 12:12$ /- and should the sum collected that evening not reach the sum guaranteed, that the Lodge should make up the difference.

Greenock War Memorial

It was agreed to recommend the Lodge to grant the sum of £20 towards the Greenock War Memorial Fund. This sum to be in addition to the amount of the Special Collection (£8:9:6) subscribed on St John's Night.

Lodge War Memorial

In connection to a memorial to our members who gave their lives during the War, it was proposed that it should take the form of a memorial altar with the names of the fallen inscribed thereon and that the members of the Lodge should get an opportunity of subscribing.

It should be noted that the $\pounds 28:9:6$ given to the Greenock War Memorial Fund would have a purchasing power of $\pounds 1241.00$ today in 2019. It is humbling to think that No. XII made such a significant contribution to the wonderful Cenotaph at which we remembered a few weeks ago.

Lapel Badges

For many years, the late Bro Henry S Tibbles PM sold anniversary lapel badges in aid of the Grand Lodge Benevolent Fund through the West Column, the monthly newsletter of the Provincial Grand Lodge of Renfrewshire West. Recently, he passed the mantle on to our Treasurer, Bro David Stevenson. Bro David asked me to start to publicise the badge availability through *XII Talk*. This will now be a regular feature.



Lapel Badges for 25, 40, and 50 years' service are available at a cost of £5.50 each. A special "gem" set badge for 60 years is also available at £10. All prices are excluding postage.
